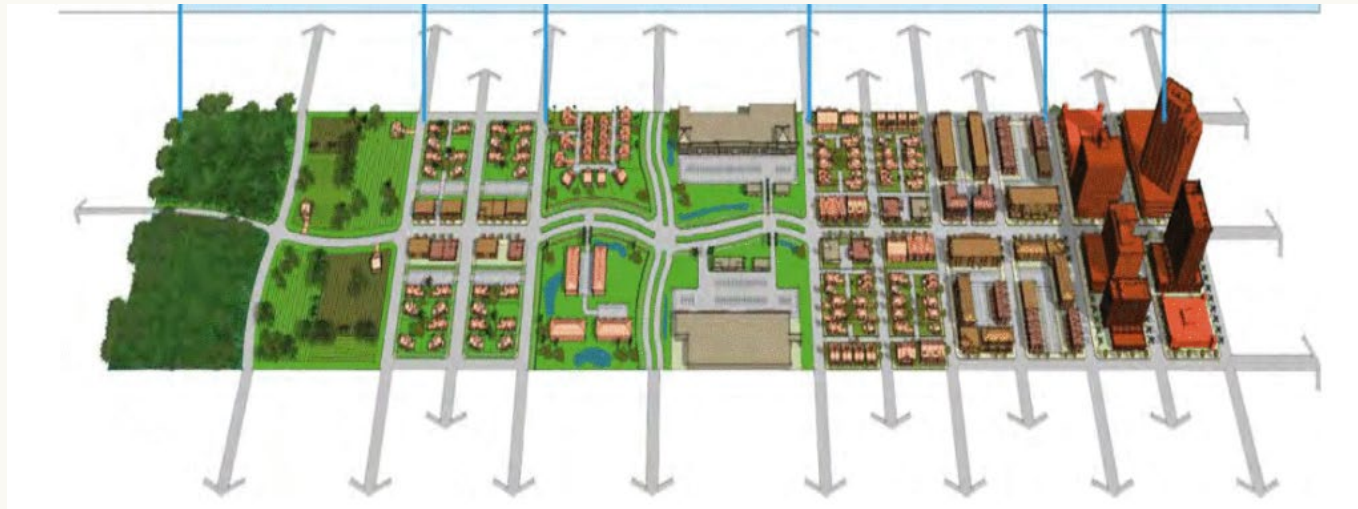

2027 Engineering Standards Update

- Annual Minor Changes/Updates
- Focused Updates
 - Transportation-Context and Traffic Calming
 - Small Lot Drainage (possible)
 - Do Not Widen List Clarifications (possible)



Transportation Update

- Develop high-level context classifications that incorporate speed ranges and design characteristics.
- Develop a traffic calming toolbox that considers context, focus this work on local streets.
- Create decision-making framework for constrained conditions.
- Move Complete Streets Guide content into the standards document.
- Add local street cross-sections for small lot development.
- New street light standards for intersection and mid-block locations.

2027 Standards Schedule



Neighborhood Connections Project

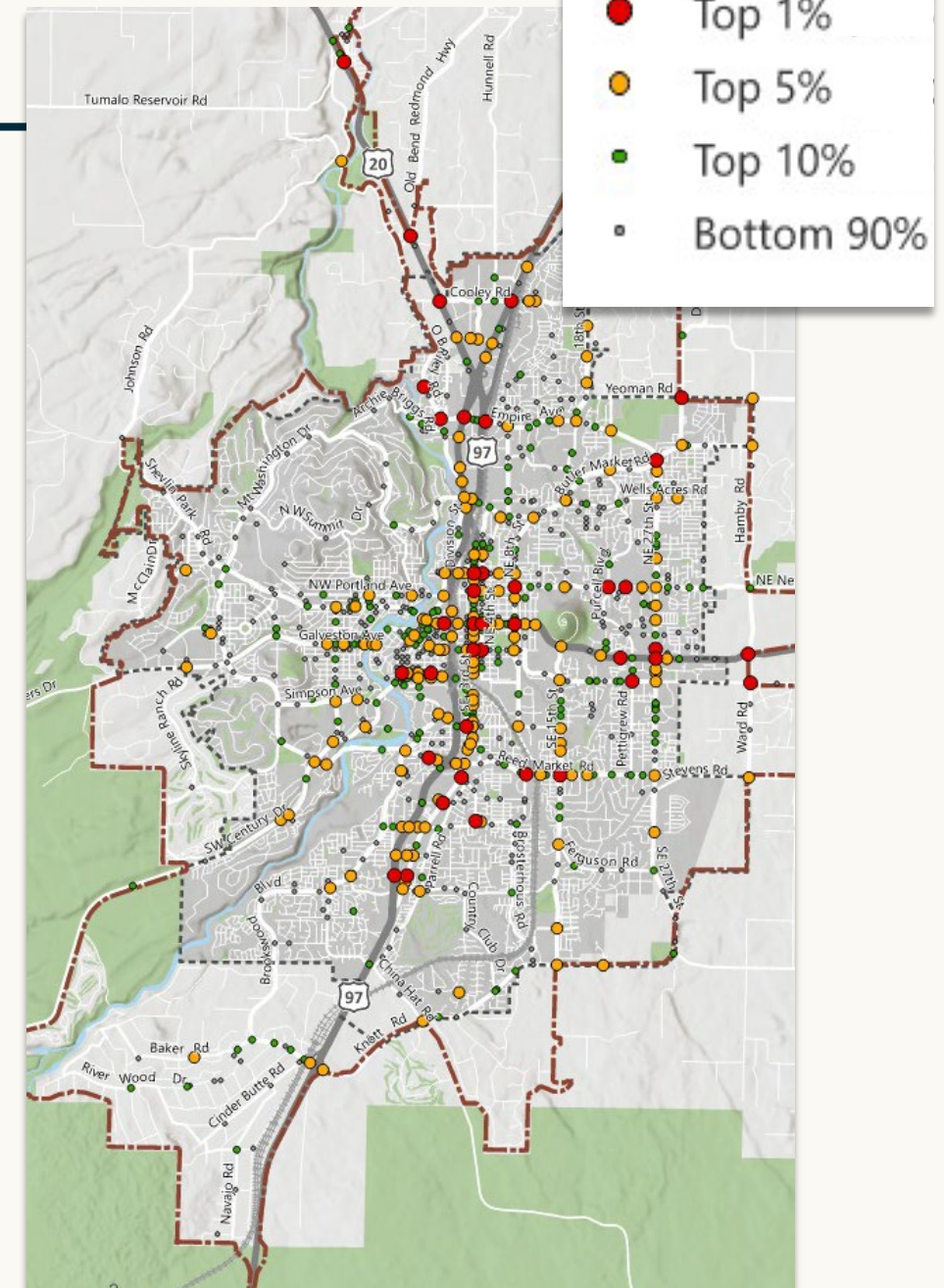
TSAP Update

- Discussion Items
 - High crash location assessments and improvement concepts development
 - Public engagement status
 - Next steps

High Crash Locations

- Top 5% = 194 intersections
- Reviewed intersections
 - Project recently constructed
 - Project programmed in local CIPs or ODOT STIP
 - Project identified in local TSPs or other planning documents
 - No project identified
- PMT identified 20 intersections for detailed review
- PMT and consultant team narrowed list to 10 intersections and then to 5 intersections for detailed concept development
- Concepts will be shared at October PAC and Policy Board meetings

*Systemic countermeasure options being developed and will be shared at October meetings



TSAP: Phase 1 Public Engagement Introduction

What the Bend Area TSAP does:

- Analyzes crash data to identify traffic safety issues; outlines targeted projects, policies, and actions (e.g.: roadway improvements, education, enforcement) to reduce fatalities and serious injuries

What's missing:

- Crash data doesn't include near-misses or identify areas where the public feels unsafe

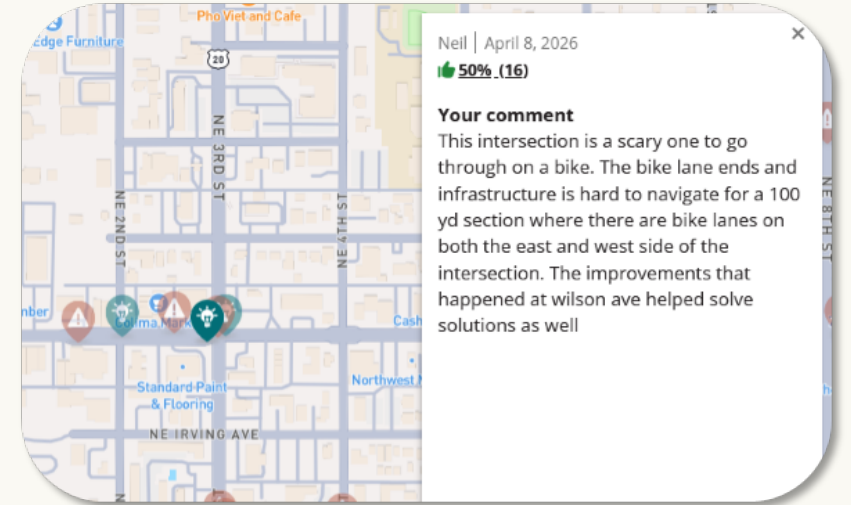
Purpose of Phase 1 of TSAP engagement:

- Gather missing anecdotal information (April – May 2026)
- Compare to what crash data is telling us

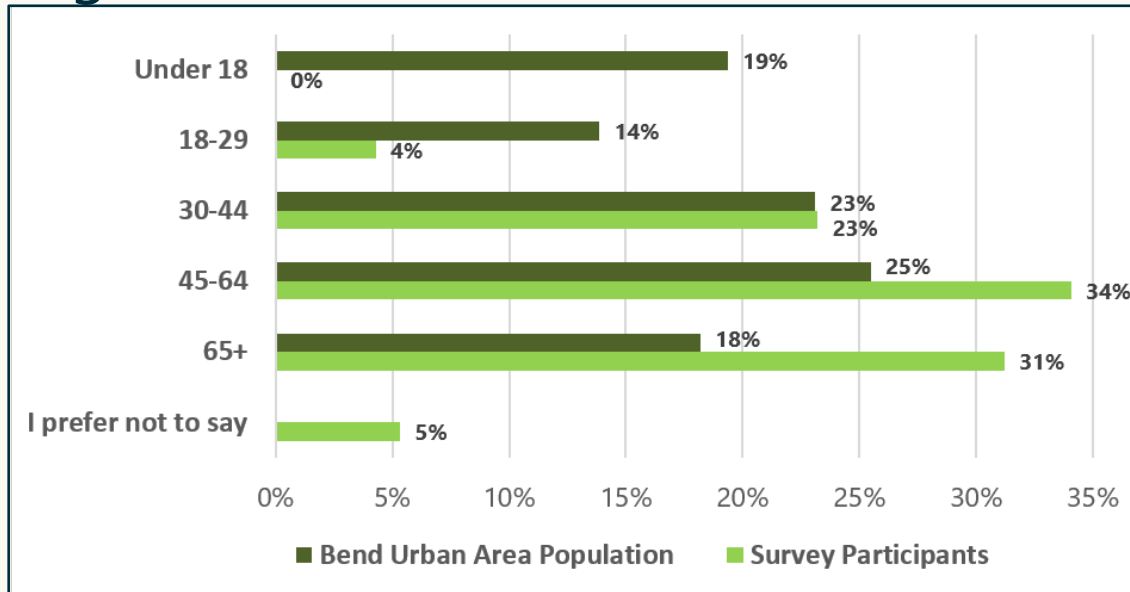

Over 2,500 unique comments collected

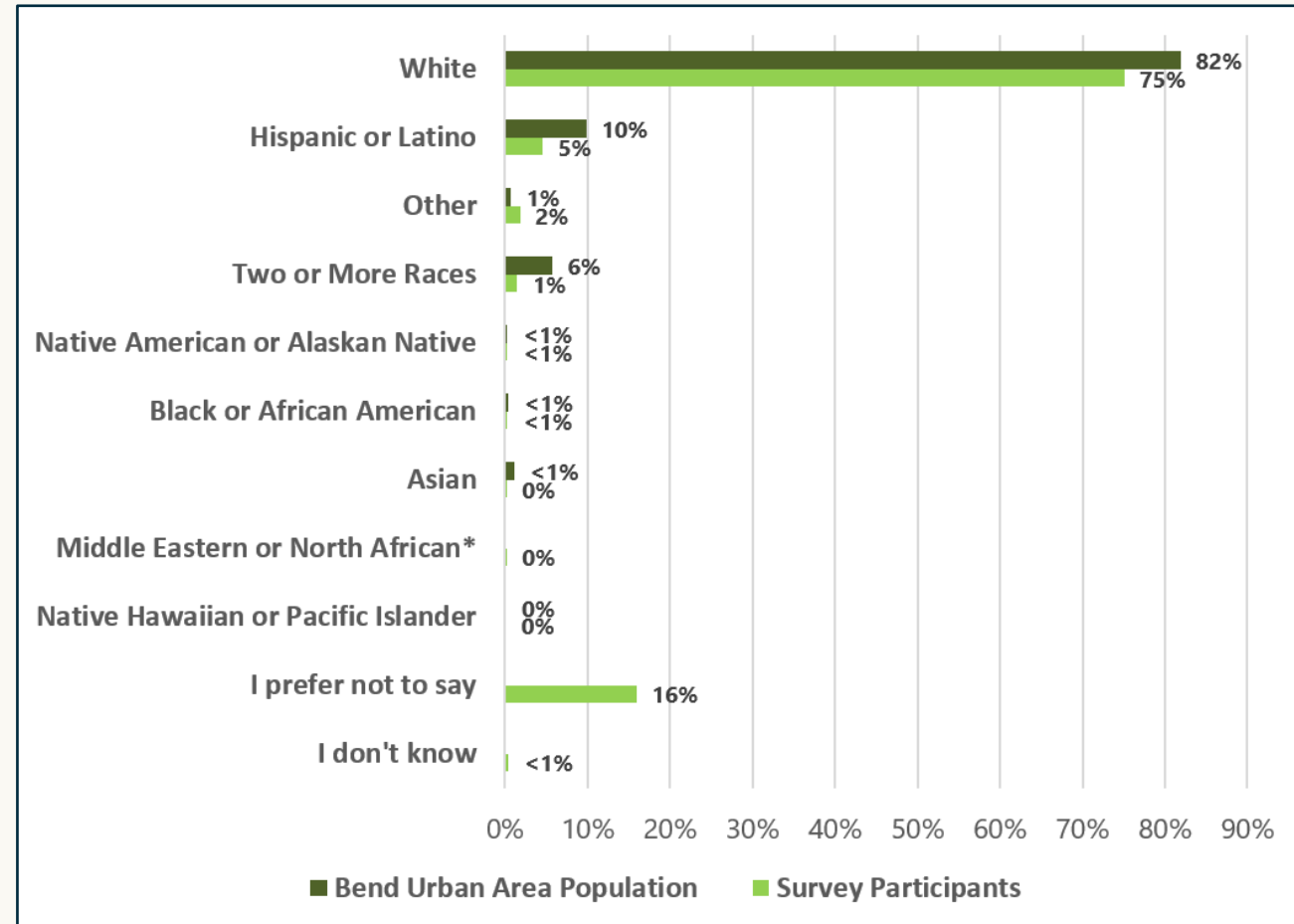

Age

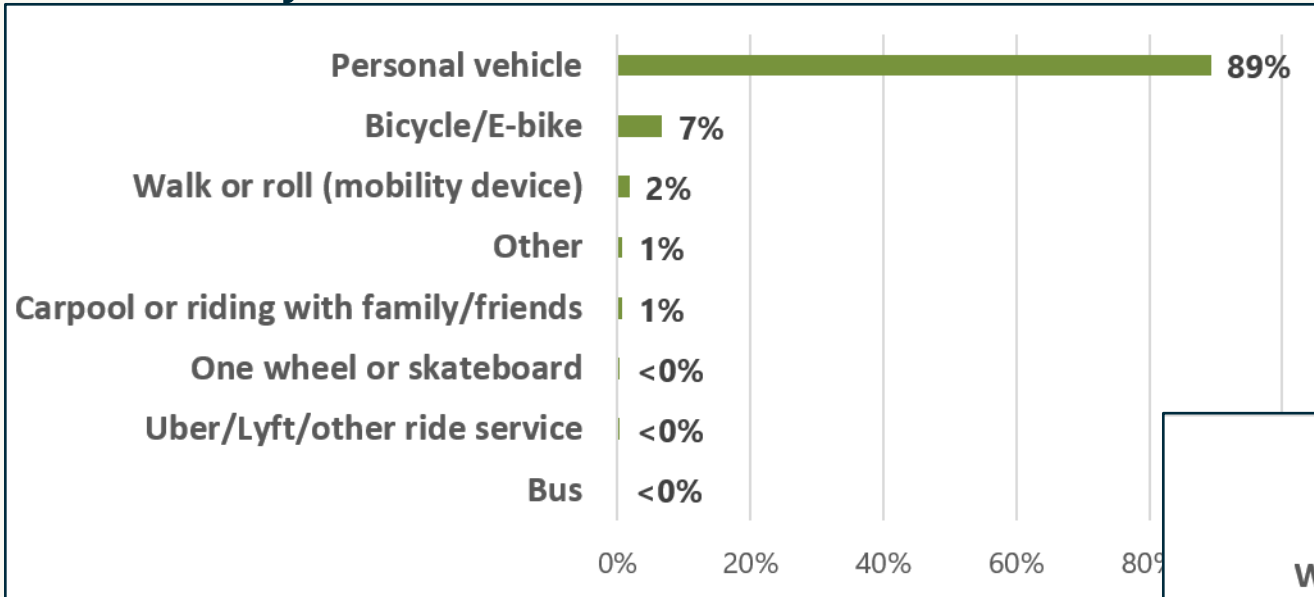


Race

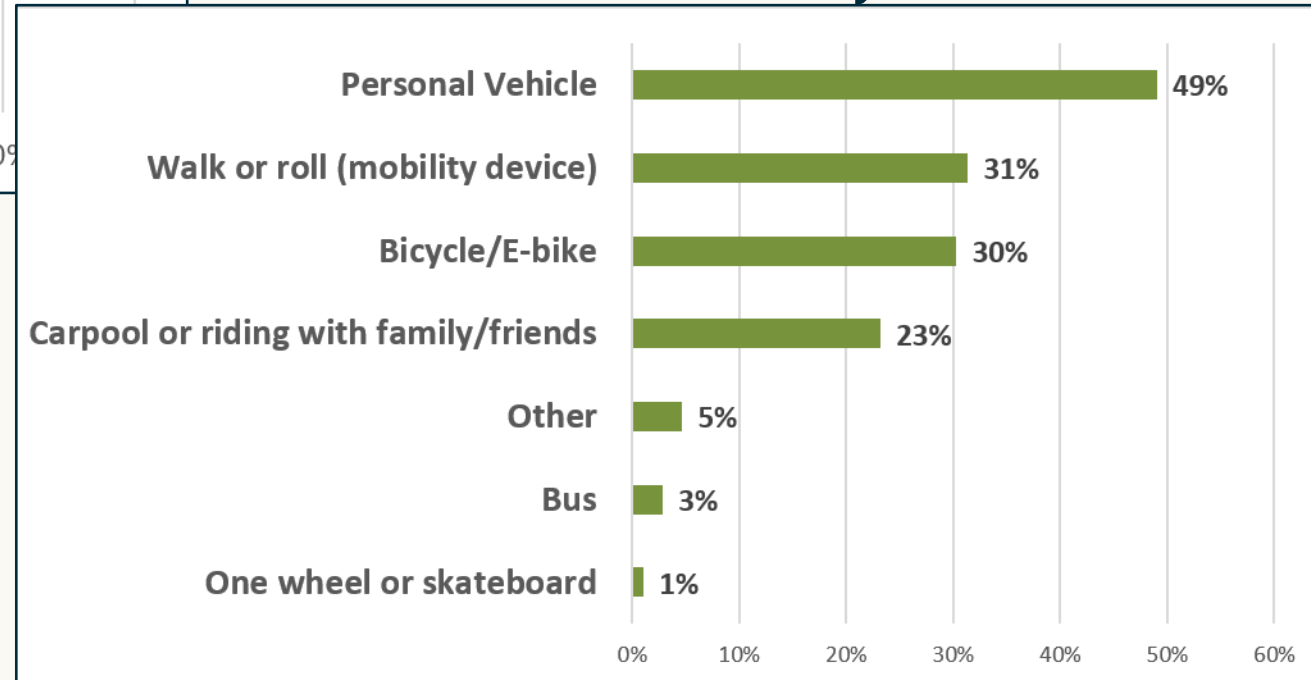


Participant Modes

Key Findings: **PENDING**

- Coding errors recently found in mapping and survey comment datasets
 - Consultant currently correcting
 - Public Engagement Summary may need to be revised
 - Expecting to present results at October TAC / Policy Board meetings
- Next steps: TSAP Phase 2 Public Engagement to begin in October
 - Online open house
 - Input on proposed countermeasures (systemic & site specific) and education and outreach strategies
 - Tabling event at Fire Department Open House, Saturday, October 17

Up Next: Phase 2 of TSAP Public Engagement

- Phase 2 Online Open House (Fall 2026) **will request public feedback on:**
 - Crash emphasis areas
 - *specific trends contributing to high % of fatalities / serious injuries – e.g.: speed, impaired driving, vulnerable users, etc.*
 - High priority locations
 - *areas w/ high concentration of fatalities / serious injuries*
 - Proposed countermeasures
 - *e.g.: infrastructure projects, behavioral-related programs, systemic improvements*
- Compare with what we hear from public
