#### Key Discussion Items/Decisions Made Updates

Cheryl Howard reported that the Franklin Corner project will be hosting a planting party on September 28. The project includes a demonstration stormwater drainage infiltration facility, an edible community garden and orchard. Wendy Edde provided the following updates.

- Wendy will participate in a statewide stakeholders group hosted by DEQ for the development of the Phase II NPDES General Permit (for drainage to surface water bodies). The group has not met yet but plans to meet over the next year.
- The Third Street Project is nearing completion. Attendees would be interested in participating on a tour of the project upon completion.
- Wendy provided updates on Stream Stewardship Day, Munch n Movies, and Bend Film outreach, and provide copies of the final Site Design walking tour guide. Leslie suggested providing copies to REI for distribution.
- The Stormwater Division is working with the Finance Department to finalize an internal rate study necessary prior to finalizing the next public draft of the Stormwater Master Plan. Staff plan to provide an update to Council prior to release of the draft plan for public review, then incorporate the public review comments prior to finalization.
- City staff have just received an internal copy of the draft Source Water Assessment study. The Source Water Assessment examines the potential sources of contaminants in the City's drinking water protection areas.

#### Key Discussion Items/Decisions Made

Wendy Edde provided the following updates:

- The NPDES permit for Phase II municipalities is envisioned to become a state general permit. Wendy is participating on a DEQ technical advisory committee comprised of municipalities and environmental interests to help DEQ develop the general permit template. Meetings are expected to take place over the coming year.
- The TMDL process is stalled due to federal legal issues.
- The Third Street Underpass Project is complete except for final striping and some ADA work that may likely need to be completed in the spring when the weather warms again.
- The Its All Connected movie slide was displayed at the Bend Film festival,
- Staff recently completed a new City Edition video on the Third Street underpass project and drill-hole pollution prevention measures. It will air in November on City Edition and on the City's You Tube channel.
- DEQ has hired Derek Sandoz as their new UIC Program Coordinator, taking over for Paula Calvert. Stationed at DEQ headquarters in Portland, Derek visited with the City recently to obtain an overview of our UIC program. He also met with DEQ staff at the Bend office and with the City of Redmond.
- The Public Outreach Strategy is undergoing internal review for coordination of utility activities. Once complete, Wendy will distribute a final version.
- The City is examining the potential for an online or smart phone application to facilitate reporting of illicit discharges. The City first examined whether coordinating statewide with other municipalities would be most effective, but it was decided that it would be too difficult to do so effectively given the different status, priorities, and IT needs within different municipalities and given some applications such as See Click Fix already exist. Wendy shared a link to the See Click Fix Application, a non-emergency problem reporting web-based application. The City will look into standard applications such as this one and other options in pursuing improved illicit discharge reporting.

#### **Annual Report Review**

Wendy circulated a hard copy of the final draft annual report, an electronic version of which had been provided as part of meeting materials for PAG members to review. The group provided positive feedback. Wendy will finalize and submit the document by the Nov. 1 deadline, providing a copy of the City's website.

#### Source Water Assessment Potential Contaminant Source Update

Wendy shared a copy of the recently completed Source Water Assessment update, focusing on updating potential contaminant source and providing a susceptibility analysis for the City's drinking water wellhead protection areas. David Buchanan managed the project that was performed with grant funding by GSI. Whereas a completed Source Water Assessment is required by the state, the development of a source water protection plan is voluntary. The Stormwater Program will use the information to help target outreach and best management practices. David will provide copies to all PAG members that requested the report.

#### Third Street Project Tour Planning

The group discussed the proposed tour options. A vote was taken to see if the PAG preferred to just visit the 3<sup>rd</sup> Street Underpass project or to include other recently completed projects. The group's consensus was to focus on 3<sup>rd</sup> Street but include the up-stream work along with the large retention pond and vault. Wendy will send out a doodle poll to help establish the best time and day for the tour.

#### Stormwater Resources Business Card—Draft Review

Wendy provided a draft business card-size educational outreach piece for review—the purpose of the card(s) is for distribution at the permit center for project proponents to easily obtain Title 16 compliance information, and for reporting illicit discharges. The group found that the web site on the It's All Connected Logo is confusing now that the link has been changed to point solely to the main water conservation page. Wendy will check with City staff on the status of the water-wise tips website to determine the site's long term plans. If the website is not going to be maintained the stormwater program will work to update the graphic. In general attendees liked the idea of the card and provided input on a preferred version.

#### Training Opportunities—APWA, OAWU, OLCA

Wendy is working on a nationwide educational stormwater training webinar for the American Public Works Association, and has been asked to provide a presentation at the Oregon Association of Water Utilities conference in Sunriver in early March. Outgoing PAG member John Low had suggested conducting outreach to the High Desert Green Infrastructure Conference in February. Chris recommended that Wendy contact Amy Jo Detweiler who coordinates the High Desert Green Infrastructure Conference.

#### **Public Advisory Group Vacancies**

Wendy announced that John Low (commercial business sector representative) has taken a new role at Ewing and will no longer be able to participate on the Public Advisory Group. PAG members made some suggestions for potential volunteers to fill the two vacant positions, one for the commercial business sector and one for the development sector. Leslie Olson suggested checking the Mirror Pond Management Board members.



#### **Updates**

After reviewing the previous meeting summary and the latest update of the action item tacking list, Wendy provided updates on plans for participating in next year's Green Industry Conference, upcoming training webinars from the Center for Watershed Protection that the City is hosting, the mailing of the ACWA "Clean Water Tips" underground injection control (UIC) brochures to residential and commercial customers in January and February; the new City of Bend Water Conservation Program Manager, Michael Buettner; exploring a potential public-private-partnership demonstration project; and participation in the REALMS school PSA

Wendy indicated that the PAG has three openings that the City is seeking to fill. **Action Items:** Wendy asked members to provide suggestions for replacements to add for consideration in addition to a list of those already being considered.

#### **Public Outreach Strategy Update**

Wendy distributed the final City of Bend Stormwater Quality Strategic Education Outreach Campaign (FY2013-14 through FY2018-19) and indicated that the City is drafting a scope of work for assistance to implement this campaign, as well as has begun work on drafting a series of fact sheets to support training and reduce illicit discharges.

**Action Items:** Draft fact sheets will be brought to the PAG for review and input at a future meeting.

## Stormwater Master Plan Project Overview, CIP Approach, and Review Discussions

The PAG reviewed the draft public outreach presentation for an overview of the project and to provide comments for improving the presentation for the general public. The PAG offered the following suggestions for improvement to the presentation:

- Simplify the presentation for general public; current level is good for more knowledgeable groups such as the IAC.
- Improve the base map to show the pipes that will be worked on and to make the UICs that will be upgraded more evident

- Show a graph of rate increases (gradual vs. instant increase). Approaches 1,2,3 gives costs of X,Y,Z that coordinates with those 3 options.
- Show the benefits of the long process for the SW Master Plan and the present advantages
- Explain the "Do Nothing" approach and how this will not work.
- Explain other benefits/ externalities.

In regards to the approach to take, the PAG suggested that lower rate increases on a regular basis work better than extended higher increases performed periodically. A formal polling of members for preferred approach was not completed at this meeting, although two members representing the engineering community indicated a preference for approach 3.

With regards to the internal revised draft Executive Summary, the PAG suggested holding off on releasing the full document until the preferred CIP approach is selected, moving Figure ES.2 to the Appendix, and incorporating the preferred CIP approach into the ES and main document; and correcting misspellings in the Acknowledgements page.

With regards to obtaining public input on the approaches, the PAG suggested the following:

- Focus the public meeting on providing input on the CIP and do not release the full report until that input is received. Then put in the preferred approach for final approval.
- In addition to BEDAB, the IAC, and holding the Public Meeting, reach out to Neighborhood Associations to present or provide information for their meetings. Consider what groups may be most opposed to any of the concepts and conduct outreach to them.
- Consider developing a City Edition and/or City Newsletter piece regarding the topic:
  - Promote what has been accomplished to date (e.g., 3<sup>rd</sup> Street, and get Third Parties (e.g., public, Fire Department) to discuss it)

- Wendy will see that the draft Stormwater Master Plan presentation and outreach materials are modified.

#### **Volunteers clean up Deschutes River in Bend**

About 75 turn out for 'Stream Stewardship Day'

#### BEND, Ore. -

From the bottom of the river and the edges of the water, to the bag.

On Thursday, the Deschutes River got a little cleaner. About 65 filled, large lawn bags cleaner, to be exact.

"There's been such an increase in use of the river, which unfortunately has led to an increase of the amount of garbage," said Upper Deschutes Watershed Council Education Director Kolleen Yake, as the council held its annual Stream Stewardship Day.

About 75 volunteers and 15 divers combed the stretch of river from Farewell Bend Park to the Old Mill.

"You can really come out and make a difference that you can see immediately," said Wendy Edde, the city's stormwater program manager. "It's got benefits not just to the river, but to everyone who comes here and enjoys it."

"I thought it would be a great way to spend my birthday," said new Bend resident Kayla Bowcutt. "I wanted to do something to get involved with the community."

They were helping with a problem that's growing nationwide.

A federal report released Thursday found four out of five urban rivers are unhealthy.

But Yake says overall, the Deschutes is doing well.

"We don't have a high amount of toxins in the river. Really, the greatest water quality problem facing the Deschutes river is stream temperature," Yake said.

In the summer, water temperatures get too warm in some areas and can kill fish and other aquatic creatures.

Because water is diverted in the spring and summer for irrigation along the upper Deschutes, the middle Deschutes suffers, becoming more shallow and heating up.

The council is helping to keep the water cooler. The organization has planted shrubs and other vegetation along the Deschutes to shade the water.

Another problem in the winter is that water is sucked out of the Deschutes and stored for the summer agricultural season.

"It's more just a water quantity problem, which leads to less habitat for fish," Yake said.

She said water problems can't be solved overnight, but even cleaning up garbage is a step in the right direction.




