- Review satisfaction level of residents living in Bend.


Methodology

- Telephone survey of 400 Bend residents
 - Land line and cell phone sample
- Conducted December 11-15, 2014
- Averaged 12 minutes in length
- Quotas for age and gender
- Margin of error +/- 4.9%, at 95% confidence level

Key Findings


Bend residents continue to rate Bend highly as a place to live

Bend as a Place to Live




Feelings on Bend as a place to work have improved

Bend as a Place to Work




Bend as a Place to Live and Work (Excellent + Good)




Feelings on Bend as a place to live 10 years from now varied

Bend as a Place to Live in 10 Years




Over 90% of responses are related to the environment, outdoors, and recreation

What do you like most about living in Bend?




Congestion and weather are least liked aspects of the City

What do you like <u>least</u> about living in Bend?




Unprompted, traffic congestion has increased as a least liked aspect in Bend

What do you like <u>least</u> about living in Bend?




Nearly 70% grade the city 'A' or 'B' for performance

Grade for City Performance




Grade for City's performance




Highest performance rating was given to drinking water service and police and fire service

Performance Ratings (8-10)




Ratings for public safety services and job creation have improved

Importance of Spending Tax Dollars (Very Important)




Residents are split on their opinions on the condition of roads in Bend

Conditions of Roads in Bend




Infrastructure and congestion are top of mind transportation issues for residents

What is the most important transportation issue?




Moderate levels of concern are seen for amount of vacation homes and rental and traffic, parking, and crowds due to special events in the City

Level of Concern




However, residents are twice as likely to be 'not at all concerned' than 'very concerned'

Overall, half of residents support public funds being used to address these issues, though most do not feel so strongly

Support Funding to Address Problems



What does the research tell us?

- Residents love living in Bend.
 - Almost all mention the environment, outdoors, and recreation when talking about what they like about living in the City. These are core values for what people believe Bend is a great place to live.
- The City is on the right track.
 - Even during the recession the city continued to see high ratings as a place to live and increased ratings on overall performance.
 - Issues most important to residents (drinking water service and public safety) are also the services rated highest in performance.
- Traffic congestion and transportation related issues are an increasing trend worth watching.
 - Traffic congestion was the top mention for least liked aspect of the city.
 - Maintaining existing streets and sidewalks also experienced a significant increase in importance compared to 2013.
