A RESOLUTION APPROVING SUPPLEMENTAL BUDGETS AND BUDGET APPROPRIATION ADJUSTMENTS FOR THE 2017-2019 BIENNIAL BUDGET PERIOD BEGINNING JULY 1, 2017.

Public notice that a supplemental budget will be considered is required, and this notice was published on or before Friday, February 2, 2018. Additionally, the proposed budget adjustment will provide for appropriation adjustments related to specific grant funds in accordance with ORS 294.338(2). ORS 294.338(2) does not require a supplemental budget or public hearing.

An increase to Interfund Transfer appropriations and reduction in Contingency will also fund engineering staff assistance related to coordination and management of building permit and inspection processes during the LEAP IIPA project (\$131,300) and two positions in the CDD Development Services Division to backfill for current Development Services division staff who will assist with the LEAP IIPA project (\$227,500).
