

HOW GOALS WERE FORMED / OUTREACH



- Fair housing survey (jointly with Redmond) 750+ responses from region
- Con Plan survey (public online survey) 500+ responses
- City's statistically valid Community Survey
- Two meetings with disability community: COBACC and COCA
- Public comment from AHAC meetings (including HB 4006 Rent Burden Meeting in Dec.)
- Public comment from Council meetings
- Meetings with the public (including Open House meetings)
- BEDAB meeting(s)
- Consultation with specific partners: County, Central Oregon Health Council, Mosaic, NeighborImpact (as the Continuum of Care), Housing Works (as housing authority), various State departments (OHA, OHCS, DLCD, Regional Solutions, etc.)

Affordable Rental Housing Production & Preservation

 Produce and preserve rental affordable housing through creation of new rental units, providing any land available for development of rental units, and obtaining rental units to keep them affordable.



Provide Support to Necessary Public Services

 Provide assistance to necessary and prioritized public services, including material, structural and staff support as needed. Increase community capacity for Permanent Supportive Housing a "Housing First" model programs.



Affordable Homeownership Production and Preservation

 Produce and preserve owner occupied affordable housing through creation of new homes, providing any land available for development of new homes, and obtaining homes to keep them affordable.



Assist Homeless with Shelter and Services

 Increase the number of homeless shelter units and transitional housing units, while preserving and enhancing existing facilities, and provide services the homeless population. Increase the community capacity to provide a lowbarrier emergency facility where individuals with certain criminal convictions and addictions can have shelter.



Infrastructure Improvements Including Child Care Facilities

 Development of infrastructure, particularly in conjunction with affordable housing development or for economic development in low to moderateincome neighborhoods. An additional focus area includes increasing the number and capacity of child care facilities through public infrastructure improvements.
