




Land Use Plan Alternatives

**Alternative C: 57%** 




North/South Collector Options

# SOUTHEAST AREA TRANSPORTATION PLAN PROJECTS



#### Short-term (Years 0-10)

- ✓ US 97/Powers Rd Interim improvements
- ✓ US 97/Murphy Rd NB on-ramp & SB off-ramp
- ✓ Key Biking & Walking Routes 1 (15<sup>th</sup> St); 8 (27<sup>th</sup> St); & 11 (Murphy Rd/15<sup>th</sup>/E-W collector)

### Mid-term (Years 11-15)

- √ 15<sup>th</sup> St safety & capacity improvements
- ✓ Reed Mkt Rd/15<sup>th</sup> St intersection safety & capacity improvements
- ✓ Upgrade of Knott Rd from rural to urban standards (under consideration)

### Long-term (Years 16-20+)

- ✓ 27<sup>th</sup> St upgrade from Bear Creek Rd to Ferguson Rd
- Expansion Area (timing driven by development)
  - ✓ New N-S and E-W collectors



# **FUNDING CHALLENGES**



- Federal and State funding is limited, variable, and generally declining
- Fuel tax is declining (vehicle efficiency) and not keeping up with inflation
- Limitations on property taxes and general fund revenues
- No dedicated usage fee (like water or wastewater have)
- Local funding sources are uncertain some sources must be approved by public vote, others fluctuate with the economy and are restricted in usage.
- Property taxes are not enough, especially in Bend

Transportation is very difficult to fund.


# DRAFT EXPANSION AREA FINANCIAL POLICY

- **F-9.** Funding for transportation infrastructure in Expansion Areas, as identified in the 2016 UGB expansion, will be determined either before or upon area plan and or master plan approval (unless exempted), and must be established prior to or concurrently with annexation. Transportation and infrastructure funding agreements will be memorialized for each expansion area property or properties in a development agreement, as part of master plan or area plan approval, and/or annexation. City/private developer cost sharing may be based on the following:
- Construction and modernization of existing infrastructure to City standards and specifications;
- The investment in transportation infrastructure helps solve existing transportation safety, capacity, or other apparent functional issue within the existing City limits;
- There is an opportunity for local, state and/or federal grants to leverage the private investments and provide partnerships;
- Other factors as determined by the City Manager.



- Median/Turn Lane








