

## **BACKGROUND**





- 2017 SEI construction complete
- June 2017 Septic to Sewer Advisory Committee (AC)
  - Engineering Design & Finance Strategy
  - 300-foot rule driver
  - Public involvement
- July 2018 AC recommendations
  - Cost estimate \$30MM
  - \$25k cap
  - Citywide strategy
- Aug 2018 3 public listening sessions
- December 19, 2018 Council adopted Septic to Sewer Conversion Program

## **SEPTIC TO SEWER CONVERSION PROGRAM**




- No new septic systems
- Removes "300-foot rule"
  - Repairs permitted if sewer is not legally available
- Neighborhood Extension Projects (NEPs):
  - Application process for City to construct sewer mains and laterals
  - \$2.5M annual budget
  - Requires a Connection Fee
- Capital Improvement Projects (CIPs):
  - Strategically combines construction projects with NEP Projects
  - Requires a Connection Fee

## Connection is voluntary **unless**:

- 1. A sewer main is adjacent to the property <u>and</u> the existing on-site septic system fails or needs repair; or
- 2. The property owner applies for improvements adding capacity to the dwelling or to the existing septic system (i.e., partition, ADU, additions/expansions, etc.); or
- If the property owner signs an NEP application that is selected for funding, they
  must connect within 2 years




