- Program Coordinator has been ½ time MPO and ½ time City for past several years
 - Seeking to make full-time MPO in FY2020-21 budget
- City of Bend creating Transportation Department
 - MPO may move into that department or remain in Growth Management Dept. (no decision likely for 6+ months)

- Transportation model updates & future strategy




