Introduction

- Our Mission: Our mission is to love people well, without judgment while helping them address life threatening issues of:
 - Homelessness
 - Hunger
 - Substance abuse
 - Physical and mental illness
 - Domestic violence
 - Trauma
- What We Do: SHM is a non-profit currently serving our community by providing the following services, free of charge:
 - (2) Residential Recovery Centers for men, women and their children housing for up to 40 residents
 - Winter Shelter in Bend for up to 65 men, women and families (with COVID distancing)
 - Winter Shelter in Redmond for up to 25 men, women and families
 - Project SHARE mobile outreach
 - (2) Graduate Homes for up to 18 men

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Objectives

- Save lives
- Provide a safe place to shelter and sleep
- Provide two meals a day
- Provide clothing and toiletries
- Partner with other providers and community members to assist with life issues:
 - Case Management
 - Substance Abuse
 - Medical & Mental Health
 - Housing
 - Employment

This Year's Bend Winter Shelter Affirms the Need

• Shepherd's House operates the only low barrier shelter in Bend. The following are statistics for the current year as of Jan. 1, 2021

Nights Open: 40 Guest Sign Ins: 1,980 Nightly Average: 50 Individuals Served in 40 Days: 210 (170 men, 40 women)
