INTRODUCTION & METHODOLOGY

From December 7th-10th, 2020 DHM Research conducted a telephone survey of Bend residents. The purpose of the survey was to assess satisfaction with City services, benchmark attitudes to previous years, and gather feedback on residents' priorities. Results will be used to help plan strategic goals for the next biennium.

Research Methodology: The telephone survey consisted of 305 residents and took approximately 13 minutes to complete. This is a sufficient sample size to assess resident opinions generally and to review findings by multiple subgroups, including age and gender.

Respondents were contacted by a live interviewer from multiple lists which may include a list of registered voters; a landline household list compiled from public records and consumer lists; and a cellular consumer list based off of cell and cable consumer information matched to publicly available address information. In gathering responses, a variety of quality control measures were employed, including questionnaire pre-testing and validation. Quotas were set by age and gender. Quotas and weighting by age, gender, education, and ethnicity ensure results represent the City's residents.

Statement of Limitations: Any sampling of opinions or attitudes is subject to a margin of error. The margin of error is a standard statistical calculation that represents differences between the sample and total population at a confidence interval, or probability, calculated to be 95%. This means that there is a 95% probability that the sample taken for this study would fall within the stated margin of error if compared with the results achieved from surveying the entire population. The margin of error for this survey is +/- 5.6%.
