# 4. Review and Approve November 4, 2020, Draft Meeting Summary

Data: November 4, 2020 (Agenda Attachment A)

**Motion 1** (12/0/0): Mr. Bryant moved approval of the November 4, 2020, meeting summary as presented. Mr. Williams seconded the motion which passed unanimously.

# 5. STBG Funding – Project Evaluation and Funding Recommendation

Data: Memo (Agenda Attachment B), Funding Summary Sheet, and Staff Criteria Evaluation/Scoring Sheet

Ms. Napoli outlined the Surface Transportation Block Grant (STBG) funding application process. Her summary included background/timeline, other important considerations (readiness of project/timing, availability and/or likelihood of other funding sources), ranking results of staff and TAC overall), and rationale for the staff funding recommendation. Eight project applications (1 transit, 7 bike and/or pedestrian) were submitted. She asked the TAC to discuss other considerations not covered in the application criteria and to develop a funding recommendation for the Policy Board.

TAC members generally agreed to use the ranking results as an initial prioritization. Overall concerns included the impact of VMT (vehicle miles traveled) exposure, source of STBG funding amounts, funding one project for four years versus multiple projects over four years, and the impact of partially funding project requests. Concerns specific to each project included:

# • Bend Mobility Hub Development

Type: Transit

Applicant: Central Oregon Intergovernmental Council

Request: \$150,000 (2022), \$150,000 (2023), \$150,000 (2024)

TAC concerns: alternate funding (General Obligation [GO] bond), allocating funds to site acquisition without knowing deliverables.

#### SE Brosterhous Road – BNSF Pedestrian Undercrossing

Type: SRTS (Safe Routes to Schools)

Applicant: City of Bend & Bend-La Pine School District

Request: \$231,624 (2021), \$148,376 (2022)

TAC concerns: feasibility, cost, structural integrity of existing railroad structure, impact of reducing funding for one or both years requested, alternate routes, interest between BNSF and City to redo the structure in the future, top two priorities of all City projects requesting funding, alternate funding (GO bond funds, school district), population (affected, number), likelihood this project would be built, impact on matching funds of moving requested amount to another year.

# NE 8<sup>th</sup> Street – sidewalk and crosswalk for Juniper Elementary/Pilot Butte Middle School

Type: SRTS

Applicant: City of Bend Request: \$184,100 (2023)

TAC concerns: alternate funding (GO bond), match fund resources, impact of in-kind contribution on funds for construction.

# SW Larkwood Drive – sidewalk for Pine Ridge Elementary

Type: SRTS

Applicant: City of Bend Request: \$90,000 (2023)

TAC concerns: need, funding improvements on a local street, alternate funding

(GO bond).

# NW Wall Street – curb extension at Idaho Avenue for Amity Creek Elementary

Type: SRTS

Applicant: City of Bend

Request: \$22,500 (2023), \$95,000 (2024)

TAC concerns: more a traffic-calming project than SRTS.

# Relaunch Bike Share Program

Type: SRTS

Applicant: City of Bend

Request: \$60,000 (2021), \$115,000 (2022), \$70,000 (2023), \$120,000 (2024)

TAC concerns: need, population (affected, number), impact of not funding Year 1, private-sector project with limited mobility, leveraging match funds, need, impact of partial funding, impact of moving funding to Year 2, great project but daunting for the limited STBG funding available.

## Central Oregon Historic Canal Trail – crossing safety improvements

Type: SRTS

Applicant: Bend Park and Recreation District

Request: \$64,218 (2021)

TAC concerns: funding Blakely and Brosterhous crossings before Ferguson Road, alternate funding (BPRD Capital Improvement Program), need, population (affected, number), key project on low-stress network to get across town.

# Bend-La Pine School District Juniper Elementary – accessible trail from crossing guard

Type: SRTS

Applicant: City of Bend Request: \$60,000 (2023)

TAC concerns: need (accessible trail design), alternate funding (GO bond), population (affected, number), impact of STBG funding on GO Bond accessibility, how and where funds could be moved to other years.

Mr. Deke shared public comments received on the STBG funding application process.

Motion 2 (11/1/0): Ms. Smith moved to approve the funding recommendation as modified in the "TAC Scenario": \$94,500 to SE Brosterhous Road (BNSF Pedestrian Undercrossing) in 2021; \$26,000 to Central Oregon Historic Canal Trail (crossing safety improvements to Blakely Road and Brosterhous Road) in 2021; \$142,532 to SE Brosterhous Road (BNSF Pedestrian Undercrossing) in 2022; and \$38,218 to CO Historic Canal Trail (crossing safety improvements to Ferguson Road) in 2022. Ms. Swirsky seconded the motion which passed with Mr. Bergh, Ms. Breault, Mr. Bryant, Ms. Hamada, Mr. Potwin, Mr. Russell, Ms. Smith,

Ms. Swirsky, Mr. Thomson, Mr. Viola, and Mr. Williams voting in favor, Mr. Stroud opposed, and none abstaining.

Mr. Deke promised staff would send potential dates and times to the TAC this afternoon for a special meeting next week to complete the TAC evaluation process.
