#### 1. Call to Order - Introductions

Chair Campbell called the regular meeting of the Bend Metropolitan Planning Organization (Bend MPO) Policy Board to order at 11:36 a.m. on Tuesday, March 16, 2021, with a quorum of member jurisdictions present (3 of 3). Vice-Chair Perkins arrived at approximately 11:42 a.m., after approval of the minutes but before Motion 2.

#### 2. Virtual Meeting Guidelines

Ms. Anderson reviewed the meeting guidelines.

#### 3. Public Comment

None.

#### 4. Review/Approve Policy Board Minutes

Data: February 16, 2021 (Agenda Attachment A) and February 23, 2021 (Agenda Attachment B)

**Motion 1** (3/0/0): Mr. Chang moved approval of the February 16, 2021, and February 23, 2021, draft meeting minutes as presented. Mr. Townsend seconded the motion which passed unanimously.

#### 5. 2020-2021 Budget Adjustment

Data: Issue Summary and Resolution 2021-01 to adopt the budget amendment (Agenda Attachment C)

Ms. Anderson provided an overview of the proposed adjustment to the fiscal year (FY) 2020-2021 Budget adopted in May 2020. This supplemental budget will add \$20,205 in Resources to align the budget with the annual funding agreement (#34292) between ODOT and the Bend MPO.

Policy Board concerns included how the City of Bend/Deschutes County In-Kind Match funds worked.

Motion 2 (3/0/0): Mr. Chang moved approval of the [fiscal year] 2020-21 Supplemental Budget by way of Resolution 2021-01. Ms. Schenkelberg seconded the motion which passed unanimously.

#### 6. 2021-2024 Metropolitan Transportation Improvement Program

Data: Summary of proposed MTIP amendments (Agenda Attachment D)

Ms. Anderson outlined the proposed MTIP amendments. Mr. Deke provided additional details about the proposed amendments Key 22395 and to Cascades East Transit's Bend-to-Mt. Bachelor-and-Elk Lake summer service route. Ms. Napoli stated she was updating the MPO outreach plan to expand the notification process.

Policy Board discussion covered the MPO and ODOT current public outreach processes.

**Motion 3** (3/0/0): Ms. Schenkelberg moved approval of the proposed amendments to the 2021-2024 MTIP as presented. Mr. Chang seconded the motion which passed unanimously.

#### **INFORMATION ITEMS**

#### 7. Surface Transportation Block Grant Funding

Ms. Napoli reported the MPO will receive additional STBG funding of \$127,600 per year for fiscal years 2021-2024 and COVID Relief Act funding of about \$1.5 million (must be allocated by September 30, 2024, and completed by 2029). She reviewed the Policy Board's funding decision for the projects selected in 2020. Mr. Deke added details about how the new funds could be spent.

Policy Board concerns included possible uses of future STBG allocations, stability of annual STBG funding, flexibility of new STBG funds, whether to fully fund selected projects from the 2020 competitive application process or roll the extra STBG funds into the next competitive application process (fall 2022), and staff capacity to engage in another solicitation process before fall 2022. Following discussion, Policy Board members generally supported the idea of making 2020 projects that were not fully funded "whole."

**Motion 4** (3/0/0): Ms. Schenkelberg moved to approve the use of additional STBG dollars to fully fund selected projects from the 2020 STBG application process. Mr. Chang seconded the motion which passed unanimously.

Following discussion, the Policy Board directed staff to study the most efficient way to move forward with allocating COVID Relief Act funding of approximately \$1.5 million and make a recommendation at the next meeting.

#### 8. US97/Baker Road Interchange Area Management Plan

Mr. Morehouse discussed the project background, purpose, study area, draft goals, schedule, decision-making structure and public outreach, conclusions and next steps of the development process for the US97/Baker Road IAMP.

Mr. Deke noted the main driver for this project was increasing urban growth that has resulted in congestion and safety issues at the US Highway 97/Baker Road intersection.

Policy Board concerns included the MPO's role in the Project Advisory Committee, other organizations that should participate (Homeless Leadership Coalition), and if at least one Policy Board member should attend Project Advisory Committee (PAC) meetings.

Chair Campbell volunteered to attend the first PAC meeting. She directed staff to synthesize discussion from each PAC meeting at the following Policy Board meeting.

#### 9. Proposed Federal Rule Changes

Mr. Deke discussed potential impacts on Bend MPO discretionary federal revenue streams and the planning boundary of proposed changes to the Metropolitan Statistical Area. He asked Policy Board members to share their comments with him by March 20.

Policy Board discussion covered which federal agencies were proposing the rule changes, which classification was more favorable to the MPO (Metropolitan or *Micropolitan* Statistical Areas), stability of Bend's population, if the MPO should ask its Congressional delegation to intercede, and impact on MPO staffing levels.

Mr. Deke offered to monitor the proposed federal rule changes and report to the Policy Board if Congressional intercession would be needed.

Chair Campbell suggested she and Mr. Deke write a letter for her signature on potential impacts of the proposed Metropolitan Statistical Area rule changes on the Bend MPO. Policy Board members generally agreed to her suggestion.

Mr. Deke discussed federal rule changes under consideration regarding urbanized areas and population and how these might impact the Bend MPO.

MPO staff provided an overview of fiscal year (FY) 2021-2022 budget including expected revenues, proposed expenditures by major work task area and budget line item, 2021-22 changes/opportunities/issues, and 2021-22 priorities. Also discussed were the 2021-22 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) and budget schedule.

Dear Congressman Bentz,

I am writing on behalf of Bend MPO Policy Board to express our support for the City of Bend's request for funding to complete the US97 interchange at Murphy Road. I serve on the Bend City Council and am chair of the Bend MPO. I have served on both for 6 years and have learned that a robust transportation system is essential for an excellent city.

Completion of the interchange will create opportunity for developing a mix of residential and employment lands in our most recent urban growth boundary expansion. A complete interchange will allow road grid systems in large vacant parcels that currently have limited road access. Development of these lands and transportation networks align with the goals of several transportation and land use plans.

Bend has consistently been one of the fastest growing cities in the US for much of the past 20 years. This interchange serves a rapidly growing area in southern Bend.

- Thousands of homes have been approved for construction or are in the planning review process
- A new high school is also under construction in this area
- The Bend Park and Recreation District is currently building a new regional park
- Significant employment lands will be served by this interchange

Completing this interchange is critical to provide transportation routes choices in SE Bend, improve safety and to alleviate congestion on other roadways in that area.

Our residents approved a general obligation bond in November 2020 to construct a wide range of transportation improvements throughout the City. Included in that bond is \$10 million to put toward completion of this

interchange. The City is seeking additional funding to fully construct the interchange and an associated frontage road.
