

Introduction

- Request: Consider adoption of the updated BMPO Public Participation Plan
 - Federally-required plan
 - <u>Purpose</u>: To establish a documented process for providing interested parties with reasonable opportunities to be involved in MPO processes.
 - Last updated in 2009 and amended in 2013
 - Staff has completed the update process for the Draft Plan

Focus Points of Plan Update

- Confirm any changes in fed/state legislation re: public participation and MPOs
- Build off recently updated Title VI Plan (non-discrimination and equity)
 - Concerted outreach to community organizations during plan development
- Document newer, successful public outreach processes and tools currently used, or to be used in the future

Completed Review Activities for Draft Plan

Federal and State Partner review – FHWA, FTA, ODOT

- Two comments, no concerns raised
- 45-day Public Comment Period advertised
 - <u>Comments received</u>: use of acronyms; officials not listening to public input; bike/ped safety at Empire/Hwy 97; all MPO items must be produced in other languages
- BMPO Policy Board review May 18th public meeting
- BMPO TAC review June 2nd public meeting, *recommended approval*

All comments and responses documented in Appendix C of Plan (in agenda).

- Minor language edits
- Added Appendix C: Comment Log
- Content otherwise unchanged from May Policy Board presentation
 - Introduction purpose of plan, fed/state requirements



- Analysis of 5 years of crash data
- To be updated with new data as available
- Current crash data is available through 2019

 217 fatal/severe crashes


41% involved speed

👬 3% (6 crashes) involved pedestrians




Bend/Deschutes County Transportation Safety

Current Grant Funding

- ODOT Transportation Safety Division provided grant funding to begin work on non-infrastructure measures
 - Funding for 2020-2021
 - Focus on behavioral issues (e.g. speeding, intoxicated driving)
 - Prepare & implement a Safety Communications Plan
 - Develop a Safety Communications Calendar
 - Allow oversight through a Regional Safety Committee
 - Create a long-term funding strategy



Oregon MPO Consortium (OMPOC)

- Forum for Oregon's MPOs to work together on matters of mutual interest and statewide significance
- Includes 2 elected officials from each MPO
- https://www.ompoc.org/
- April 30 meeting
 - Directed staff to develop a priority position paper that could be used to advocate for allocation of federal funding
- July 30 meeting
 - Reviewed and revised draft legislative policy position paper

Draft paper includes 5 broad goals

- Fund bicycle, pedestrian and public transportation projects & planning
- Use transportation investments to reduce greenhouse gas emissions from the transportation sector, improve safety, and increase the resiliency of the transportation system
- Transportation investments support improved outcomes for everyone, particularly people of color and low-income populations
- Invest locally and support local engagement, direction, and planning of the transportation system
- Improve transit access, impact, and help build more transit projects

Input from other MPOs

- Salem/Keizer: Provide funding to support the development of affordable intercity/intercommunity public transportation options, to allow greater access to goods, services, and employment opportunities that are too often lacking in smaller communities
- Medford/Ashland: concern about one item specific to the MPOs with air quality issues
- <u>Albany</u>: ensure smaller and more rural community needs are included in policy and programming decisions
