1. Call to Order – Introductions

Vice-Chair Perkins called the regular meeting of the Policy Board for the Bend Metropolitan Planning Organization (Bend MPO) to order at 12:10 p.m. on Tuesday, August 17, 2021, with a quorum of member jurisdictions present (3 of 3).

2. Virtual Meeting Guidelines

Ms. Anderson reviewed the meeting guidelines.

4. Review/Approve Policy Board Minutes

Data: June 15, 2021 (Agenda Attachment A)

Motion 1 (3/0/0): Ms. Schenkelberg moved approval of the June 15, 2021, draft meeting minutes as presented. Mr. Townsend seconded the motion which passed unanimously.

5. Public Participation Plan (PPP) Adoption

Data: Background memo (Agenda Attachment B), Resolution 2021-04 (Agenda Attachment C), draft plan (Agenda Attachment D)

Ms. Napoli discussed review activities completed for the draft PPP (Public Participation Plan). Included in her summary was input received during the 45-day public comment period and changes since the Policy Board review at the May 18, 2021, meeting.

Motion 2 (3/0/0): Mr. Doty moved to adopt the Public Participation Plan by way of Resolution 2021-04. Vice-Chair Perkins seconded the motion which passed unanimously.

Vice-Chair Perkins turned control of the meeting over to Chair Campbell, following Chair Campbell's arrival at approximately 12:20 p.m.

6. 2021-2024 Metropolitan Transportation Improvement Program Amendments

Data: Summary of proposed MTIP amendments (Agenda Attachment E)

Ms. Anderson summarized proposed MTIP amendments to Project Keys 22442, 21229, and a new project for Bend MPO Planning Reserves (key number not yet assigned). Mr. Townsend provided additional details about funding for the construction phase of Key 21229. He promised to update the STIP to correctly reflect Deschutes County's participation in the funding process for Key 21229.

Motion 3 (3/0/0): Vice-Chair Perkins moved approval of the proposed amendments to the 2021-2024 MTIP as presented. Ms. Schenkelberg seconded the motion which passed unanimously.

7. Transportation Safety Action Plan Grant Application

Mr. Deke, with assistance from Ms. Anderson, reviewed the background. His summary included what was contained in the Transportation Safety Action Plans (TSAPs), key crash attributes for Fatal/Severe crashes (2015-2019) in unincorporated areas of Deschutes County, current grant funding, grant application objectives, and next steps. Upcoming events related to the TSAPs:

- August 18, 2021 (Wednesday) Bend City Council meeting
- August 25, 2021 (Wednesday) Deschutes County Commission meeting
- September 9, 2021 (Thursday) Central Oregon Area Commission on Transportation (COACT) meeting
- September 2021 Central Oregon Safe Travel Survey and Media Campaign
- September 30, 2021 (Thursday), 11:30 a.m.-1:30 p.m. Safe Travel Summit

Mr. Bryant asked if the 31 traffic crash deaths in 2020 was a record number per year.

Policy Board concerns included the cost effectiveness of the Bend MPO's creating a new messaging campaign versus investing in amplifying existing message campaigns which have been in place for several years.

Motion 4 (3/0/0): Ms. Schenkelberg moved approval for staff to submit a grant application for funding in federal fiscal year 2021-2022 to continue work to implement the Bend and Deschutes County Transportation Safety Action Plans. Mr. Doty seconded the motion which passed unanimously.

8. **OMPOC Legislative Priorities**

Mr. Deke reviewed OMPOC's draft legislative priorities and input from other Oregon MPOs.

Motion 5 (3/0/0): Chair Campbell moved the Bend MPO Policy Board support the draft OMPOC legislative priorities document. Ms. Schenkelberg seconded the motion which passed unanimously.

Mr. Deke presented a list of future meeting topics and requested Policy Board feedback.

Policy Board members indicated interest in all of the suggested topics. Specific requests included the Intelligent Transportation Systems Plan, Safe Routes to Schools (local work), low-stress bike and pedestrian network, household travel survey, Oregon climate change work, Bend Parks Comprehensive Plan, and school sites/facilities plan.



Executive Summary

WHAT IS TSMO?



To Whom it May Concern,

I am writing on behalf of Bend MPO Policy Board to express our support for the FLAP grant application for SW Century Drive being jointly submitted by the City of Bend and ODOT Region 4. I serve on the Bend City Council and am chair of the Bend MPO. I have served on both for 6 years and have learned that a transportation system that prioritizes safety and accessibility for all is essential to a thriving city.

This project proposes to improve pedestrian and bike connectivity to public lands adjacent to city and MPO boundaries. Currently, lack of infrastructure and high-stress conditions exist along the SW Century Drive corridor for cyclists and pedestrians, causing limited access to forest lands. From the MPOs perspective, this has been of growing concern due to growth in this area, increase in traffic and speeds, and recent crashes, including driver and cyclist fatalities. To work to correct this unsafe and inequitable impediment to public lands access, the project proposes several crossings and infrastructure improvements; many are the result of city staff working with directly affected neighbors and neighborhood associations.

The following summarizes the improvements proposed in the FLAP grant application, all of which the Bend MPO Policy Board fully supports:

- Repave SW Century Drive (MP 4.63 21.98)
- 30% design for an over/under crossing at SW Century Drive and Skyline Ranch Road to connect Tetherow trail to Haul Road Multiuse Trail
- Enhanced crosswalk at SW Century Drive at Mammoth Drive connecting to Haul Multiuse Trail (ADA ramps, illumination, 10' safety island)
- Remove SB right turn lane at Mammoth Drive and convert to buffered bike lane
- Remove existing sidewalk between E Campbell Road and Mammoth Drive on SW Century and replace with 10' multi-use path
