Ms. Napoli and Ms. Anderson provided an overview of their work with the Bend Office of Performance Management. Their summary included the equity mapping tool, how this tool related to the MPO's federal requirements around nondiscrimination and equity, and how the tool might be used in the future.

Policy Board concerns included the change in senior population (age 65 and older) between 2017 and 2019, total number of people living in poverty within the MPO area, and ways the mapping information can be useful.

Mr. Bryant asked how the senior population boundary was determined. Ms. Anderson responded that the U.S. Census Bureau provided this information.

Bend Metropolitan Planning Organization FY2021-22 Supplemental Budget Amendment

Issue Summary:

Metropolitan Planning Organizatio

Bend Metropolitan Planning Organization (BMPO) received a grant award from the Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT) Safety Division. The grant award is for transportation safety work focused on the BMPO and Deschutes County areas.

A Supplemental Budget for fiscal year (FY) 2021-22 is required to add these funds.

Background:

BMPO was awarded grant funding from the ODOT Transportation Safety Division (TSD) to continue work on transportation safety action plan objectives that began with development of the Bend and Deschutes County Transportation Safety Action Plans (TSAP). Grant funding was awarded in 2018 to the City of Bend and Deschutes County to develop these plans. Grant funding was awarded in 2020 to the Bend MPO for implementation of the non-infrastructure action items included in both TSAP's.

The previous 2020 award was used to complete the following tasks:

- ✓ Create and implement a Safety Communications Plan for Bend and Deschutes County
- ✓ Develop a Safety Communications Calendar
- ✓ Create a plan to implement a Regional Multidisciplinary Safety Committee
- ✓ Host a community campaign and event on transportation safety

Bend MPO, in coordination with Deschutes County, cities of Bend and Redmond, and other community partners, continued the momentum forward by hosting a Safe Travel Summit and Community Survey in September of 2021. Project details can be found at www.bendoregon.gov/transportationsafety

Objectives:

In 2021-2022, BMPO will continue transportation safety efforts in regional public meetings to promote safety efforts and culture, potentially housing these efforts within the Central Oregon Area Commission on Transportation (COACT). We are seeking to expand our scope to include the greater Central Oregon area (Deschutes, Jefferson & Crook counties). Our upcoming work will include a review of the latest crash data to ensure we implement relevant non-infrastructure emphasis area improvements comprised of communications and action items to reduce fatal and incapacitating crashes. Our focus will be to establish partnerships to mobilize community resources and spread the word about adopting a safe travel culture across Central Oregon.

Lastly, we will work with partner agencies to create a funding strategy to continue a safety committee and communications going forward.

Funding:

The grant award of \$95,000 and a requirement of in-kind match from local jurisdictions with staff time and community involvement activities is effective from October 1, 2021 to September 30, 2022.
