

UPDATE: PENDING LEGISLATION



HB 2006

- Requires City to approve an application for an emergency shelter that includes sleeping & restroom facilities.
- Does not need to comply with land use process.
- Must comply with building codes, is within a UGB, is not sited in a mapped natural disaster or hazard zone w/o complying with hazard regulations.
- Has adequate transportation access to commercial and medical services, will not pose an unreasonable risk to public health or safety.
- HB 2006 is time-limited, expire July 1, 2022.

HB 3261

- Requires City to "unconditionally allow the conversion of the lawful use of a property" from use as a hotel or motel, to use as an emergency shelter, if the site is within a UGB, not in an area designated for heavy industrial use, has adequate transportation access, and is not within a designated hazard or natural disaster area.
- City can require compliance with building codes and occupancy limits, but not land use process.


Shelter Type	Example
Mass shelter- large gathering space, sleeping area not separated.	Warming shelter
Outdoor Shelter Site- lot/ parcel for temporary units.	Veterans Village, Hope Village (Medford).
Short-term shelter- permanent facility with individual rooms.	Bethlehem Inn, Project Turnkey.
Private residence- RV, other allowed for relative?	Our Wildfire RV allowance- like Emergency Order
Other type- what are we missing?	?? Peer cities review next meeting

- Mass shelter- large gathering space, sleeping area not separated.
- Definition: a building that contains one or more open sleeping areas, or is divided only by non-permanent partitions, furnished with cots, floor mats, or bunks, for temporary overnight accommodation of people who are homeless or lack permanent housing. The shelter may or may not have food preparation or shower facilities.
- Examples: Bend's Warming Shelter, Shepherd's House





Outdoor Shelter Site

 Definition: a lot or parcel on which mobile or temporary units are placed for use as transitional shelter.

Examples: a managed camp concept,
Veteran's Village, Hope Village, Rogue
Reach Urban Campground, Casitas de

Esperanza,

Microsites





Short-term shelter

• **Definition:** permanent facility with individual rooms.

• Examples: Bethlehem Inn, Project

Turnkey projects





- RV as ancillary use
- **Definition:** Temporary use on a lot associated with a single family dwelling.
- Examples: Bend's Medical Hardship or Wildfire Hardship allowance.




SUMMARY OF ACTION ITEMS
