2. Deliberation of prioritized list of strategies

Members deliberated the prioritization of each strategies.

3. Vote on prioritized list of strategies to recommend to full Environment and Climate Committee

All members agreed to the following ranking:

1. (EB2C) Create new incentive packages that increase the installation of energy efficiency projects on residential and commercial buildings
2. (EB1A) Participate in code update processes and vote for advancing energy efficiency in codes
 - a. Notes: want to communicate how important code is to make impact; want to make sure that code officials are supporting energy efficiency
3. (EB3A) Develop a home energy score program
4. (EB2D) Create revolving loan funds to finance energy efficiency projects
5. (EB2E) Support and expand workforce development programs in energy efficiency trades
6. (EB4A) Develop incentives that encourage private developers to build smaller housing options
 - a. Notes: additional opportunity for economic incentives, zoning has been complete but not the whole picture
7. (EB3C) Support and expand low cost energy audit programs
8. (EB2A) Increase community education on energy efficiency and available incentives
9. (EB2B) Promote energy efficiency incentives offered by utilities by providing this information during the permitting process
10. (EB1B) Develop and deliver outreach and education campaigns promoting net zero ready standards
11. (EB3B) Develop voluntary disclosure and benchmarking programs for public and commercial buildings

12. (EB2F) Explore options for demand response programs
