CAAB will begin to discuss high level funding priorities to inform a more in-depth conversation at the April 21 meeting. Staff has put together an interactive mapping tool to support this discussion that shows locations of the following data resources within or adjacent to the Core Area TIF boundary:

• City of Bend Capital Improvement Program (CIP) projects: Projects programmed for funds in the City's adopted budget for the 2021-2025 CIP.

- Transportation General Obligation (GO) Bond funded projects: Transportation projects that were approved for funding from the 2020 GO Bond by voters.
- Permit and land use applications pulled/issued since the adoption of the Core Area TIF Plan & Report (August 18, 2020)
- Low Stress Network (LSN) routes identified in Bend Transportation Plan- The LSN is a system of connected bicycle infrastructure that allows cyclists of all abilities, including children, to comfortably access their destinations. Examples include protected bike lanes, separated pathways, and neighborhood greenways.
- Transit Routes
