## **DEPARTMENT UPDATES**

### **Flooding Response by the Transportation & Mobility Crews**

David Abbas, Transportation & Mobility Director, provided the following update regarding the response to the flash flooding that occurred around town on June 2<sup>nd</sup> as a result of the sudden storm:

- The biggest cleanup efforts on June 3<sup>rd</sup> are in the areas of 17<sup>th</sup> and Troon and Monterey Pines off of Newport.
- Nashville has a lot of debris east of Harmon. It is possible the new drainage galleries along Newport were full and the debris kept running east to the park.
- The cleanup effort during the night of June 2<sup>nd</sup> was focused on the Knoll and Skyliners area.
- We brought in everyone we could for sweeping crews to follow behind the crews cleaning up the heavy debris.
- The most wide-spread challenge is fresh bark mulch recently spread that washed out across sidewalks or curbs and into the street. This cleanup will be ongoing over the next week or so.
