## RESOLUTION NO. 3306

### RESOLUTION AMENDING RESOLUTION NO. 3259 BY INCREASING RATES FOR SOLID WASTE COLLECTION PROVIDED BY FRANCHISE OPERATORS WITHIN THE CITY LIMITS.

#### Findings:

- A. Ordinance No. NS-1272, provides that the City may revise rates charged for collection services by resolution.
- B. Rates for solid waste collection rates were last set by Resolution No. 3259 in June 2021, and this resolution supersedes and replaces that resolution.
- C. The franchise operators of the collection services have requested that the City adjust rates.

Based on these findings,

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEND RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. New maximum rates that may be charged by the Franchisees for franchise services are set forth below.

2. Bulk Rate for the Collection of Bulk Refuse:

~~\$12.14~~ **\$12.51** per yard or a service fee of ~~\$59.95~~ **\$61.75** per hour for 1 truck and driver (~~\$86.62~~ **\$89.22** per hour for 2 employees) plus disposal fees.

3. Definitions:

"Curbside or roadside" means at the curb or at the foot of the driveway.

"Backyard or other" means a location other than curbside. Such service is subject to the rate increases provided in Section 6, below.

4. Container Service:

The container rates set forth below are the maximum monthly rates that may be charged for service, container rent, container maintenance and disposal fees:

5. Compactor Rates:

Compactor containers will have a disposal charge of 3.0 times the un-compacted rate specified in the Emco, Inc. rate study. The service and recycling fees shall be the same as those specified in the Emco, Inc. rate study for un-compacted containers.

6. Rates for extra distance to a container or bulk refuse from the pickup point:

up to 50 feet:	regular service rate
50 to 100 feet:	additional 25%

100 up to 125 feet:	additional 50%
125 up to 150 feet:	additional 75%
over 150 feet:	additional 100%

7. Rates for pickups inside of buildings or on different floors:

Pickup inside of building:	additional 50%

Pickup from one flight above or below ground level:	additional 75%

Pickup from two flights above or below ground level:	additional 75%

8. Franchise Fee:

There shall be a 7% franchise fee to be collected monthly from each Franchisee within the City of Bend as provided for by Ordinance No. 2335; provided, however, that the City may increase the franchise fee as necessary in the public's interest. Future increases shall be at the option of the City; and any future increase may be passed through by the Franchisees at their option to their rate payers by increasing the maximum rates for franchise services. Pass through of the 7% franchise fee is included in the rates detailed above.

9. Residential Recycling:

Franchisees shall provide residential recycling services to include, at a minimum, same day twice per month curbside collection of: mixed waste paper, rigid plastic containers, natural colored high density polyethylene plastic, and State mandated recyclables except glass and oil. Residential recycling service for glass and oil shall be provided at a minimum of once per month.


10. This resolution supersedes and replaces Resolution No. 3259 and takes effect on July 1, 2022.

Adopted by a vote of the Bend City Council on June 15, 2022.
