Member Chokshi and Dietrich presented an overview of the Home Energy Score Working Groups recommendations on enforcement.

Members provided the following feedback:

- Have an incentive that highlights the codes there is value in having an incentive
- There is a limit on how much is put into the code the goal is to have as much compliance as possible so that the Home Energy Score is as valuable tool
- Monitor compliance then use tools for those not in compliance

- The goal is to not to use enforcement use education to show the importance of the program
- The focus should be on community education and working with the Central Oregon Realtor's Association on how to move forward
- The 15 days should start when the letter is sent and provides notice to the seller
- The City should focus on the productive benefits that the program will have –
 promote to encourage and subsidize additional investments more homes would
 have a higher score
- This could be a tool for the revolving loan fund to prioritize properties that should be eligible based on the score
- Have a companion program for renters
- House turnover can work towards future goals around rental property disclosures without requiring it from the beginning – this could be a data set that the City could build upon
- Get input from other communities not limiting conversations
- Construction conversations have not worked with the real estate agents the committee needs to be clear on which conversation there are having
- Expand on the FAQ's to get to the program information faster expand on other things the Home Energy Score looks at
- Once real estate agents know more about the program they will be more receptive
- Share examples to show the value of the score compare to cars
- Post examples of what a Home Energy Score looks like examples from other cities
