Pacific Power Rate Changes Update

Matthew Chancellor, Regional Business Manager at Pacific Power, provided an update regarding upcoming and expected Pacific Power rate changes (listed below). Note that ranges are provided because of different rate classes.

Except for the rate change taking effect October 1, 2022, to implement Oregon's new low-income rate class, the rate changes listed below are subject to final approval by the Oregon Public Utility Commission. However, Pacific Power believes they have received enough input from stakeholders to

provide these numbers for our planning purposes and feel the approved rates will be very close to what is listed below.

October 1, 2022

An increase of 0.3-0.5 percent to implement the Oregon low-income rate program

November 5, 2022 (to be approved by OPUC)

An increase of 0.6-1.5 percent to recover already incurred wildfire related expenses

January 1, 2023 (to be approved by OPUC) – may considering combining the general and TAM increases

- A general rate increase of 4.0-5.5 percent for continued investments in wildfire mitigation strategies, vegetation management and renewable energy resources and that reflects general inflationary impacts for skilled labor, insurance and other business impacts
- A Transition Adjustment Mechanism (TAM) increase of 4.9-7.3 percent for power costs connected to increases in wholesale energy and natural gas prices

April 1, 2023 (to be approved by OPUC)

 A combined increase of 1.7-2.3 percent to account for higher power costs (Power Cost Adjustment Mechanism – PCAM) and deferred accounting adjustments.
