Please note that City Hall will be closed on Tuesday, January 2nd, to observe New Year's Day. Have a happy and safe New Year!


City Council Downtown Parking Permits Transition to Online Permit Portal


How to View Eric King's Calendar

With new Councilors joining us, this is a great time for a friendly reminder on how to view Eric King's calendar and schedule or request meetings with Eric. Eric's calendar is visible in Outlook for anyone with a City of Bend email address. To view Eric's calendar from Outlook, please follow these steps:

- 1. Access your Calendar in Outlook.
- 2. Right-click on Shared Calendars, select Add Calendar > From Address Book.



3. Type in "Eric King" to the Address Book search bar and double click on his name. His name will appear in the bottom text field. Select OK.

4. Eric King will appear under Shared Calendars. Check the box next to his name to view his calendar.

Please note, the above steps can be repeated to view <u>any</u> City of Bend staff member's calendar.

SDC Report Submitted to the State Legislature

The final SDC Report was submitted to the State Legislature earlier this month. Many of the comments during the comment period were incorporated into the report and Appendix K addresses how feedback was incorporated. The full report can be viewed here: **SDC Report**

HUD Releases 2022 Annual Homeless Assessment Report

The Biden-Harris administration/ U.S. Interagency Council on Homelessness (USICH) plan for ending homelessness and the 2022 Annual Homeless Assessment Report were both released last week:

- NEW federal plan for ending homelessness in America: Click to read All In: The Federal Strategic Plan to Prevent and End Homelessness.
- HUD released the 2022 Annual Homeless Assessment Report (AHAR) Part 1 to Congress. The report found 14,655 people were experiencing homelessness on a single night in January 2022 in Oregon an increase of 22.5%, Despite the well-known increase in homelessness, in Oregon there were 248 fewer unaccompanied homeless youth a decrease of 18.9%.
- Additionally, the White House announced a new initiative to help cities and states reduce unsheltered homelessness. The 19 federal agencies that make up USICH will work with select

state and local governments to accelerate the implementation and effectiveness of strategies to get people off the streets and into homes.
