#### **RESOLUTION NO. 3318**

#### A RESOLUTION ACCEPTING JURISDICTIONAL TRANSFER OF THE RIGHT-OF-WAY OF COOLEY ROAD FROM BROWNRIGG LANE TO US 20 FROM DESCHUTES COUNTY

#### **Findings**

- A. A portion of Cooley Road from Brownrigg Lane to US Highway 20 described in Exhibit A and depicted in Exhibit B is currently outside of the City limits, within the City's Urban Growth Boundary, and currently under the jurisdiction of Deschutes County, Oregon ("County"). The segment is bordered on each side by a road segment under the jurisdiction of the City, creating alternating jurisdictions along the Cooley Road corridor.
- B. The Revised Joint Management Agreement Regarding the Area Within the Bend Urban Growth Boundary, 2017-423 ("JMA") Section 7.4 stipulates that roads and rights-of-way will be accepted by the City i) under the City's annexation regulations and ii) to avoid creating segments of alternating jurisdictions. The road segment described in Exhibit A and depicted in Exhibit B will be improved to urban standards under a cooperative improvement agreement between the City and Oregon Department of Transportation. The project includes a waterline, bike lanes, and a sidewalk/ shared use path on the south side.
- C. On July 29, 2020, The Board of County Commissioners adopted Resolution No. 2020-013, setting a public hearing for the proposed jurisdictional surrender of roads including the segment of Cooley Road from Brownrigg to US-20. The Notice of Hearing was posted on the following dates and locations:
  - July 29, 2020 and July 31, 2020 at the Deschutes County Road Department, 61150 SE 27<sup>th</sup> Street, Bend, Oregon;
  - ii. July 29, 2020 and July 31, 2020 at the Deschutes County Services Building, 1300 NW Wall Street, Bend, Oregon; and
  - iii. July 29, 2020 at the Deschutes County Public Library, 507 NW Wall Street, Bend, Oregon.
- D. On August 19, 2020, the Board of County Commissioners held the public hearing on the proposed action.
- E. By Order No 2020-011, dated August 19, 2020, the Board of County Commissioners for Deschutes County offered to surrender jurisdiction to the City and requested transfer of the road segment described in Exhibit A and depicted in Exhibit B.
- F. On March 1, 2023, the City Council held a first reading of an ordinance annexing this portion of Cooley Road between Brownrigg and US Highway 20, expected for second reading March 15, 2023, and an effective date of April 14, 2023.

- G. By accepting this jurisdictional transfer, the alternating jurisdiction along Cooley Road between Brownrigg and US Highway 20 will be eliminated.
- H. The City desires to accept the offer of transfer of jurisdiction under ORS 373.270 with respect to the road segment described in Exhibit A and depicted in Exhibit B, and adopt this resolution completing the jurisdictional transfer.
- I. The segment of road described in Exhibit A and depicted in Exhibit B meets the requirements for transfer under ORS 373.270:
  - i. The road is in the city limits (by annexation through the previously referenced ordinance) and the city has interest in acquiring the road;
  - ii. The county surrenders jurisdiction by order; and
- iii. The entity (city) receiving the request to transfer issues an order accepting the transfer (by this resolution).
- J. The County Road Department Director and the City Transportation and Mobility Director have reviewed the road segment described in Exhibit A and depicted in Exhibit B and are ready to formally transfer maintenance activities upon issuance of this resolution.

### Based on these findings, the City Council of the City of Bend resolves as follows:

- Section 1: It is in the public interest to accept the offer of transfer of jurisdiction of Cooley Road from Brownrigg Lane to US Highway 20 as described in Exhibit A and depicted in Exhibit B.
- Section 2: By this resolution, the City officially accepts transfer of Cooley Road from Brownrigg Lane to US Highway 20, and it shall be under the jurisdiction of the City.
- Section 3: This resolution takes effect on April 14, 2023, or the date on which the ordinance annexing the area becomes effective, whichever is later.
- Section 4: If any provision, section, phrase or word of this ordinance or its application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions that can be given effect without the invalid provision or application.
