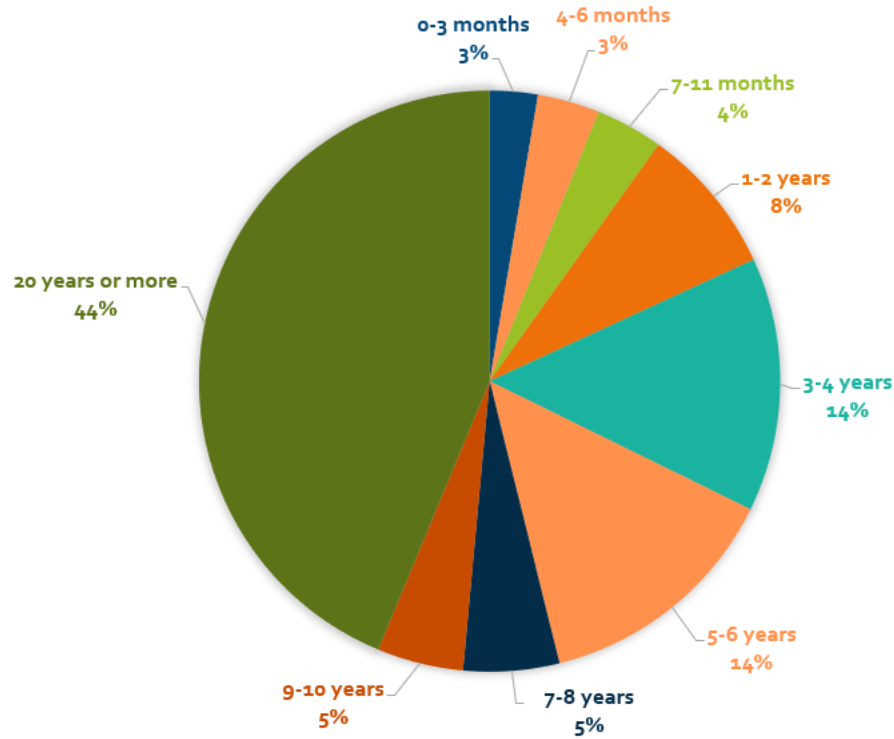
2023 Point in Time Count

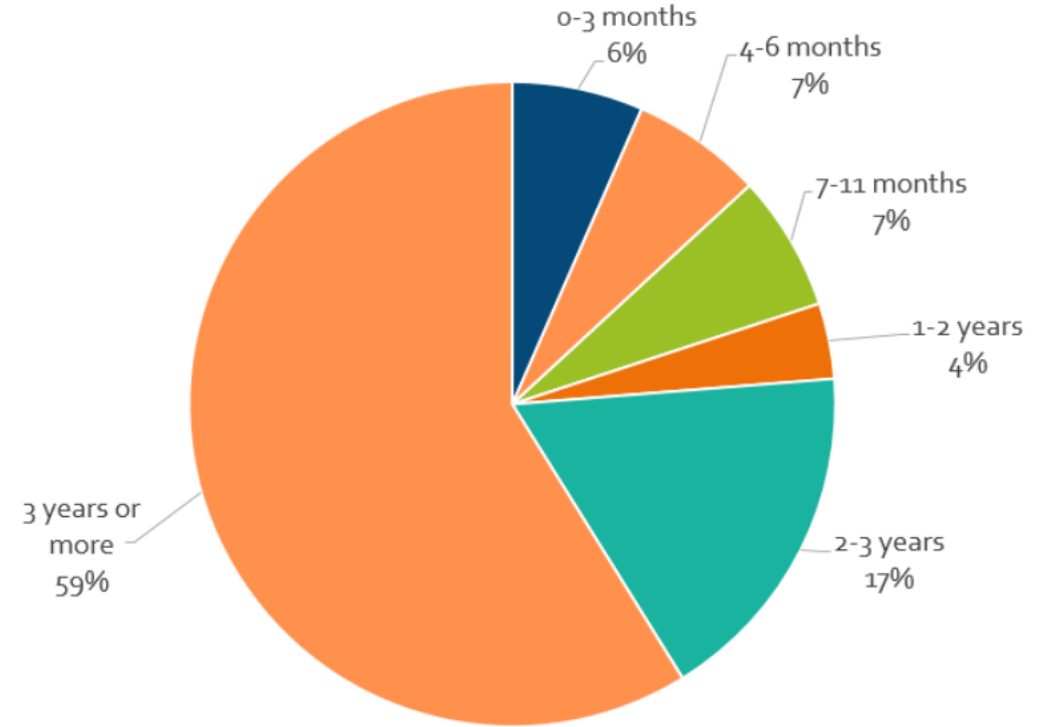

LENGTH OF TIME IN CENTRAL OREGON

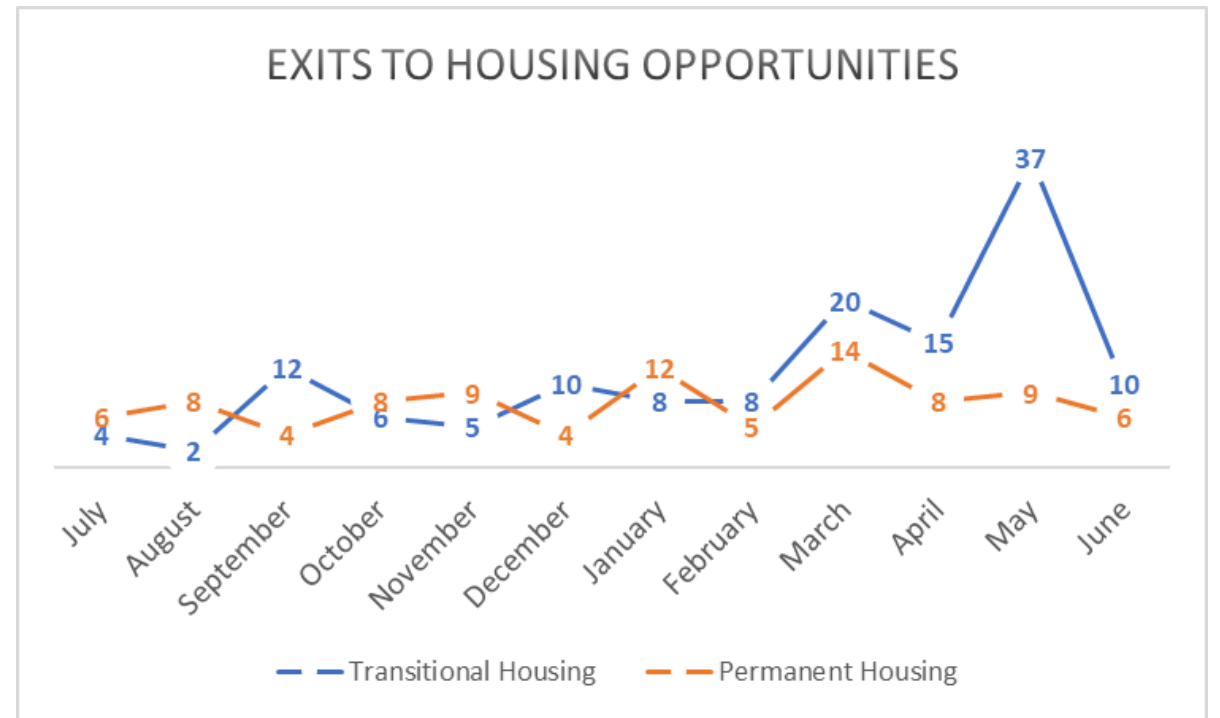
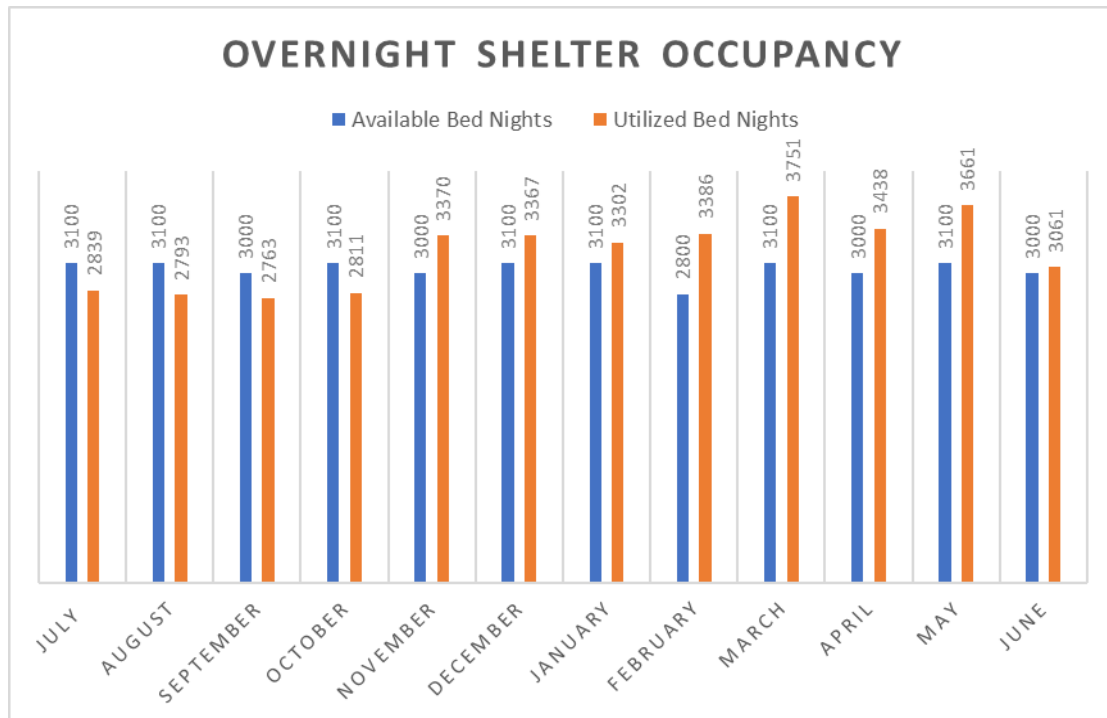


Length of time homeless

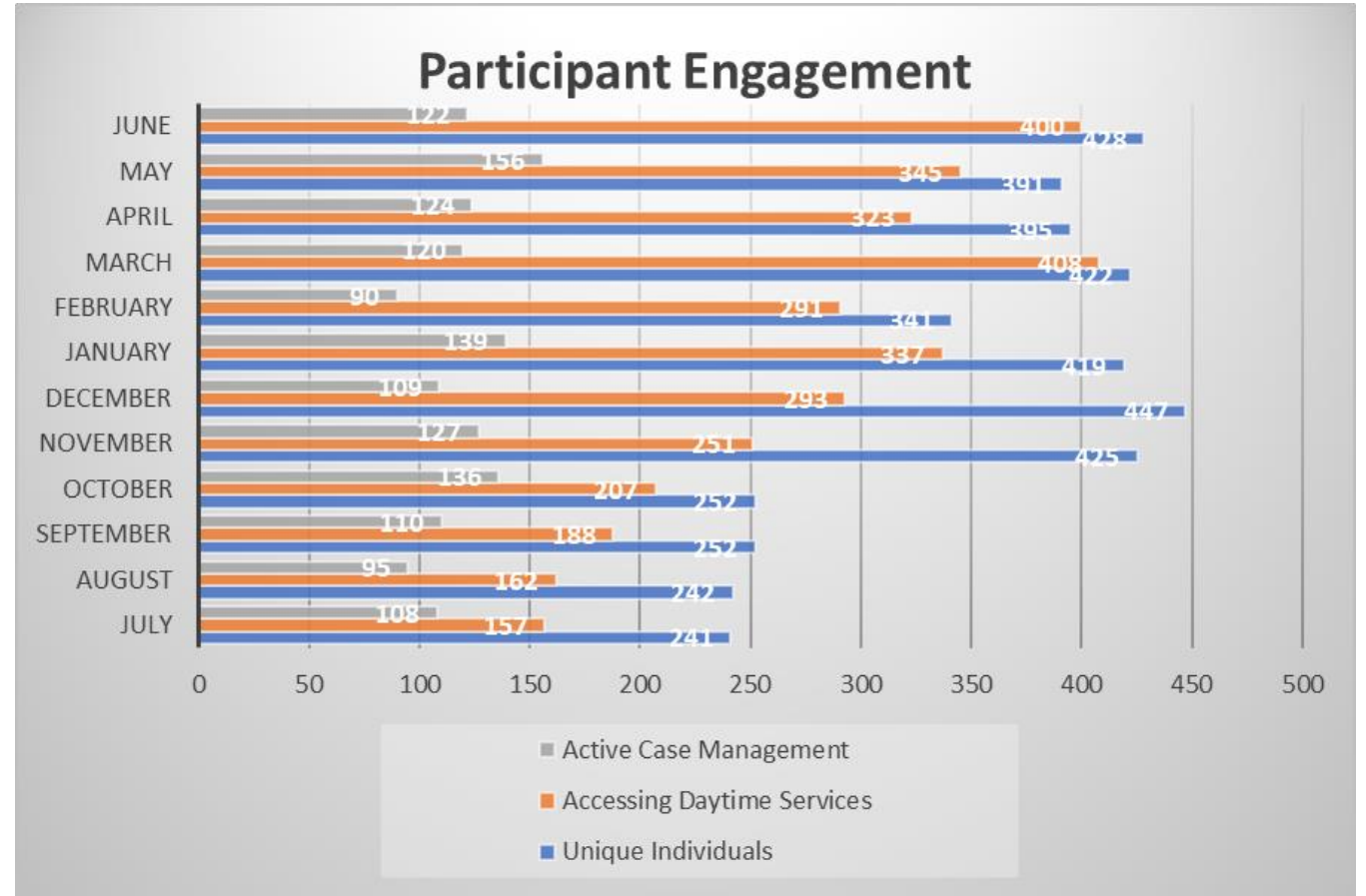


Lighthouse Navigation Center

Navigation Center: "a low-barrier emergency shelter... that is open seven days per week and connects individuals and families with health services, permanent housing, and public benefits" (HB 2006).

City Supported Shelter

500+ beds met Council Goal

- **Lighthouse Navigation Center**
 - 100 beds walk up
 - Some capacity
 - Day services
- **Franklin Avenue Shelter**
 - 60 beds by October 1
 - 46 currently
- **Stepping Stone Shelter**
 - 28 units/56 beds
 - 3 openings
- **Central Oregon Villages**
 - 8 tiny homes/12 beds
 - 12 units pending (9/23)
- **Safe Parking**
 - 5 sites /30+ beds

Enforcement of Camping Code at Hunnell

- 45 campsites
- Monday, July 17

Juniper Ridge

- Deschutes County clearing
- 150-200 campsites

Renovation of Navigation Center (\$2.6M)

- Roof and HVAC
- Multi-user bathrooms
- Showers and laundry
- Commercial kitchen frame out
- September 2023 reduced capacity
