## **Home Business**

**Quick Reference Guide to Bend's Home Business Requirements** 

## **Planning Division**





The <u>Bend Development Code (BDC)</u> establishes the rules and regulations for development in Bend. The <u>Planning Division</u> provides guidance on BDC requirements for a Home Business. This reference guide is intended to help homeowners or residents navigate City of Bend requirements. Here is a link to the <u>Bend Development Code's Home Business code section</u>.

## Does the proposed Home Business meet requirements?

- A Home Business is permitted in residential zones in an owner or renter occupied home.
- The following are prohibited as a home business use:
  - o dispatch;
  - o retail sales;
  - o ambulance service;
  - o animal hospital, veterinary services, kennels or daytime or overnight animal boarding;
  - any business involving repair, reconditioning, after-market modification or customization, sales or storage of motorized vehicles, boats, recreational vehicles, airplanes, or large equipment on site;
  - marijuana businesses;
  - psilocybin manufacturing, testing, or service center;
  - o food trucks or carts
- A home business must comply with the following. See <u>BDC 3.6.200(N), Home Business.</u>
  - The home businesses must be owned and/or operated by a resident of the home business site.
  - Outdoor storage must be completely screened behind a sight-obscuring wall or fence or within an enclosed structure.
  - o A maximum of two personal motor vehicles and/or trailers owned or leased by the residents and used in conjunction with a home business may be parked outdoors.
  - The home business must not produce radio or TV interference, glare, dust, vibration, smoke or odor.
  - o The home business must comply with daytime and nighttime noise levels.
- A <u>Class A home business</u> is one where the residents use their home as a place of work and
  no nonresident employees nor clients/customers come to the site. Class A home businesses
  also provide an opportunity for the residents to use their home as a business address but not
  as a place of work, for professions where the work is performed online or done at other
  locations.
  - No nonresident employees nor clients/customers come to the home business site.
  - No more than 25 percent of the dwelling unit, including the floor area of garages, accessory structures and an ADU, may be utilized for all home business uses.

- A <u>Class B home business</u> is one where the residents use their home as a place of work and involves a limited number of nonresident employees and/or clients or customers coming to the site.
  - o A Class B home business requires a Type I review application and approval.
  - o Only the residents of the home and one nonresident employee or one customer can participate in the home business. Off-site employees are permitted.
  - No more than 25 percent of the dwelling unit, including the floor area of garages, accessory structures and an ADU, may be utilized for all home business uses.
  - o A Class B home business is not allowed on a site with a Type II short-term rental (STR).
- A <u>Class C home business</u> is one where the residents use their home as a place of work and the scope of the business activities exceeds the standards for a Class B home business.
  - o A Class C home business requires a Type II review application and approval.
  - Only the residents of the home and up to three nonresident employees or customers can participate in the home business. Off-site employees are permitted.
  - A Class C home business is not allowed on a site with a Type II STR.
- For all home business inquiries, email the following to planning @bendoregon.gov:
  - Floor Plan: indicating the total square footage of the residence and the square footage of the room(s) where the business will be operated.
  - Provide a description of the business proposal, including the hours of operation. Indicate who is operating the business, the number of employees, storage of materials, and vehicles used for business purposes.
  - Indicate whether the business will generate noise, odor, or involve flammable or explosive components.
  - o Provide the property address.

<u>Other</u> City of Bend Community and Economic Development (CEDD) Divisions and outside agencies with home business requirements and procedures:

**Building and Safety Division.** The home business must not result in any alterations or additions to a structure that will change the primary use from R-3 (residential). Installation of commercial equipment and/or remodel of any portion of the building will require a building permit. Contact counterpe@bendoregon.gov with questions about permitting requirements.

**Business Registration.** If you are starting a new business, a <u>Business Registration</u> will be required. Renewals and changes in information must also be completed in a timely fashion for existing businesses. Contact <u>businessregistration@bendoregon.gov</u> for additional information, or visit the <u>Business Registration Program</u>.

**Fire & Rescue.** According to OFC Table 5003.1.1. any open use of more than 1 lb. of a division 1.3 explosive would not be allowed in an R-3 (Residential) occupancy. According to OFC Section 5604, indoor storage magazines are not allowed in Group R occupancies. See 8.10.030 Limits and Exceptions on Storage of Regulated Materials for details.

**Signage.** One nonilluminated wall or window sign limited to two square feet in area and located on or below the first story at a maximum height of 14 feet is permitted. No other building or freestanding signs as exempted in BC <u>9.50.050</u> are permitted. Apply for the sign permit separately. For questions, email kvoos@bendoregon.gov
