Additionally, LOC recently hosted a webinar on *Grants Pass v. Johnson Compliance*, and the recording is now available to view.

Heat Advisory this Weekend

Deschutes County Health Services sent out the following information and resources regarding the high heat expected over the weekend:

The National Weather Service has placed a Heat Advisory in effect for most of Deschutes County, beginning Saturday morning (7/20) through Monday evening (7/22); please see the attached weather briefing. For more information about forecasted heat, please refer to NWS/NOAA Heat Risk Map. There is not an Air Quality Advisory in effect, but given the many fires across the state, it is possible smoke may arrive in Central Oregon this weekend. Air quality is forecasted to be intermittent moderate levels, and not expected to rise to unhealthy for sensitive groups, unhealthy or hazardous. We know smoke is difficult to predict and may cause air quality to change rapidly.

Given the short duration of heat, cooling overnight temperatures with no excessive smoke forecasted at this time, we will not be activating additional cooling spaces at this time. Please refer to our **webpage** for the most up to date operations. Locations for the weekend will primarily be all library locations across the county on Saturday, as well as Shepherd's House Redmond and Shepherd's House Bend (Day: Blue Dog RV, Night: Lighthouse).

In addition, Deschutes County has enacted public use fire restrictions on all County-owned land and unprotected land in unincorporated areas of the county until mid-October. For more information on the specifics of the restriction and map of restricted areas, please find the press release here.

Deschutes County Health Services (DCHS) has several resources available to support clients who may be unable to access cooling centers:

\$75k Cybersecurity Grant Awarded to City of Bend

The City of Bend has been awarded \$75,000 by the State of Oregon and the Department of Emergency Management for the City's cybersecurity program. As cyber threats increase, it is vital that the City protects its data and infrastructure so that it can continue to provide the best possible services to the public. This grant will be used to leverage professional services for the improvements in the following areas of the cybersecurity program:

- City of Bend Cybersecurity Strategic Plan
- City of Bend Cybersecurity Program Charter
- City of Bend Cybersecurity Policies and Standards
- City of Bend Cybersecurity Incident Response Plan

As the City's cybersecurity program grows and matures, we will continue to look for innovative ways to financially support the program through grants. This is a big win for the program and for the City!
