

Bend Police Department Quarterly Report — Q2



Working together to cut down on organized retail theft



Beginning in March, the Bend Police Department partnered with the Deschutes County District Attorney's Office and the Redmond Police Department to host a series of retailer listening sessions as part of the Organized Retail Theft (ORT) grant that the county secured in fall 2024.

The goal? Simple. To stop organized retail theft crimes from taking place in businesses here in Deschutes County. That means finding ways to enhance the prosecution of retail theft offenders at the DA level, and it also means improving responses to theft calls and increasing arrests. The listening sessions were a first step to encourage partnerships with businesses. The county has also implemented a local chapter of the Organized Retail Crime Association of Oregon.

We encourage business owners and employees to report retail crimes—we can't help if we don't know they're happening! Beyond reporting crimes when they take place, another great idea is to register your cameras with Bend Connect. Bend Connect allows first responders to better assess and rapidly respond to criminal activity and emergencies. You can register your security cameras so our officers can reach out to you for footage in case of an incident. Businesses can also purchase a FUSUS Core device that allows Bend Police conditional access to the camera feed in case of an emergency.

The Bend Police Department will continue to look for new and innovative ways to work with businesses to eliminate retail theft in our community.

Apply for the Police Chief's Advisory Council

The Bend Police Department is currently soliciting applications from Bend community members interested in serving on the Police Chief's Advisory Council. The council consists of up to 20 community members with broad and diverse life experiences that reflect the growing Bend community. The Chief of Police will select members based on their integrity, commitment to the community, and their demonstrated ability to act as a communication conduit within their community networks.

The PCAC serves three critical missions: To advise the Chief of Police and the Police Department on various issues from the community perspective; to act as a communication conduit between community networks and the Police Department; and to enhance trust between the community and the law enforcement agencies that serve them.




enforcement, from traffic and K9s to investigations, records and evidence.

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




Top Offenses by Crime Category


Crimes Against People




Crimes Against Property




Crimes Against Society




Oregon Specific Offense



Year-to-Date Offenses by Crime Category


