Bend City Council Approves Automated Traffic Enforcement

The Bend City Council approved a contract for the implementation of automated traffic enforcement at a meeting in September.

The community has long expressed concerns about speeding and other traffic problems, and automated traffic enforcement is one tool our agency can use to address those concerns. In January 2024, the City Council directed the Department to move forward with the program. After a request for proposals, Bend Police selected Verra Mobility to implement the program.

The three-year contract will allow the Bend Police Department to move forward with camera systems at multiple intersections within Bend city limits to target drivers running red lights and speeding.

System testing, permitting and installation will take place through the end of 2025, with a 30-to-90-day warning period once the equipment is in place and operational. Full enforcement is expected to begin in the spring of 2026.

Three intersections have been identified for the initial rollout of the program: SE Powers Road at South Highway 97 northbound; SE Reed Market Road at SE Third Street westbound, and NE 27th Street at NE Neff Road in both directions. Studies are underway at an additional six intersections throughout the city.

The goal of the program is to change driver behavior and keep our community safe— for drivers, pedestrians and cyclists.

Automated traffic enforcement has been implemented in other cities in Oregon, and research has shown that it has helped improve compliance with traffic laws and deter red-light running and speeding, which are two of the leading causes of crashes in Bend.

Training Focuses on Less-Lethal Options, In-Field Medical Care



Bend Police just completed its third in-service training in September. Throughout the year, officers engage in a wide variety of training to ensure they're aware of the latest laws and that they are getting the reps they need to be effective while keeping our community safe out on the street.

This month, officers participated in an ethics class, then headed to the range to qualify on their service weapons. While at the range, officers also engaged in a scenario involving



ing in-field tactical casualty care, and worked with less-lethal weapon options that can be very effective without using lethal force.

As an agency, our officers train for thousands of hours each year—and the goal of all that training is to be prepared and capable when it matters.

Top Offenses by Crime Category

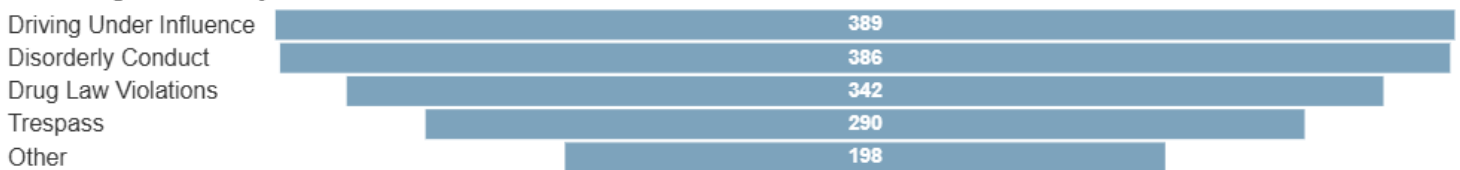

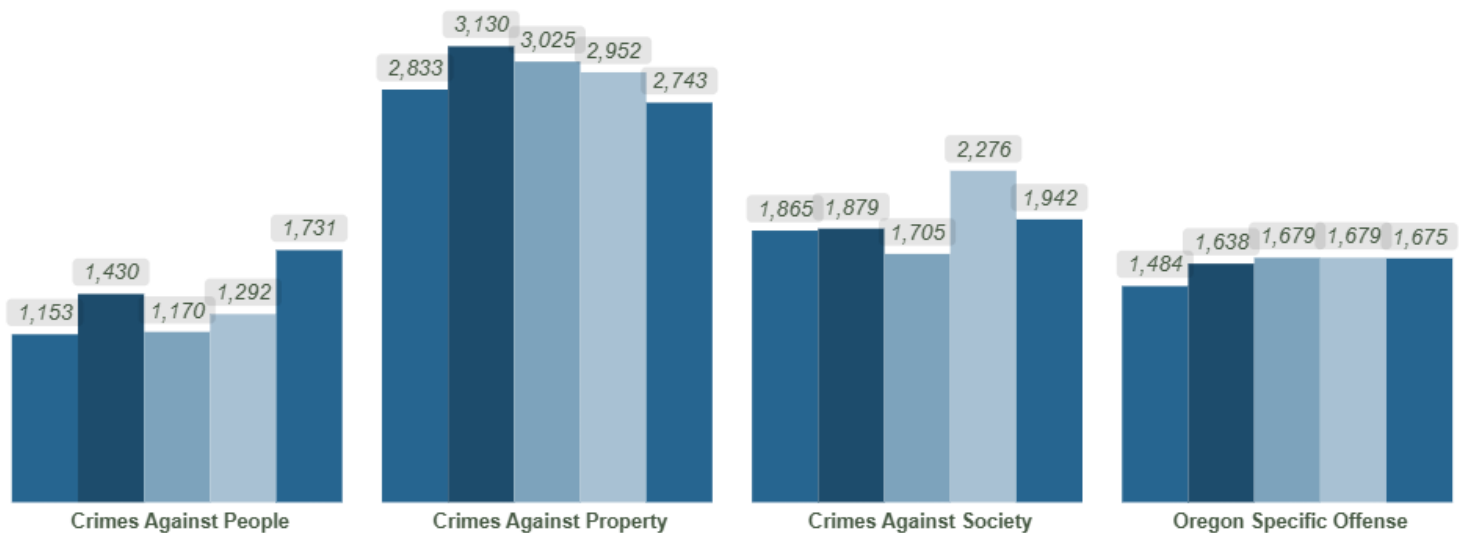


Oregon Specific Offense

● 2021 ● 2022 ● 2023 ● 2024 ● 2025

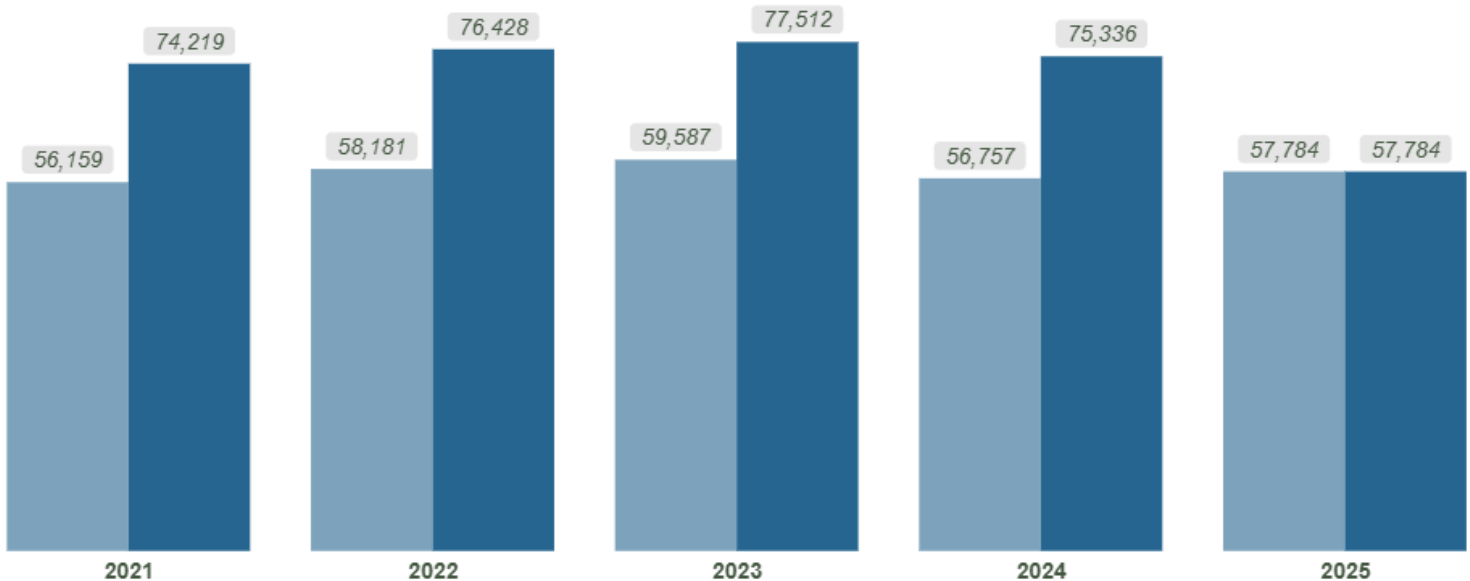

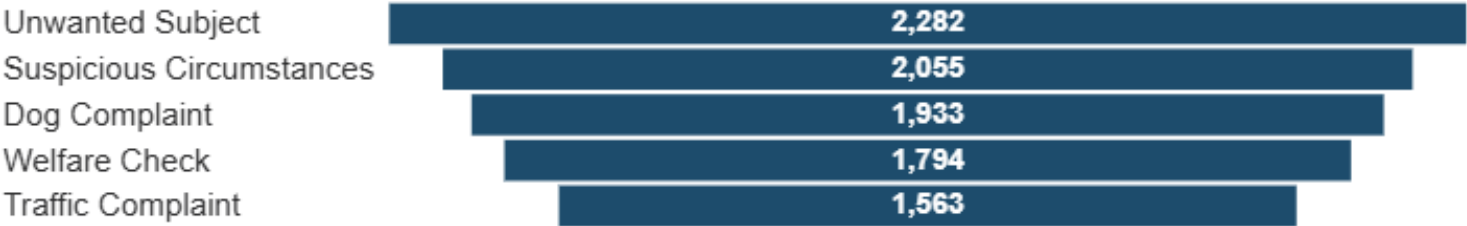
Total Calls for Service
