

Traffic Calming Improvements Coming to your Neighborhood



Safer street designs


Diverters are physical barriers that restrict vehicles but allow walking and bicycling. Installing these in Bend neighborhoods intends to minimize cut-through vehicle traffic in key locations and reduce conflicts between motor vehicles and people who walk or ride bikes. The Bend City Council approved diverters at some intersections in Bend along Neighborhood Greenways, which are safer routes for people to walk or bike on lower-speed residential streets.

Installation timeline

The City plans to install diverters (also called 'modal filters') in late March, 2026. This will impact vehicle patterns.


The City will monitor the pilot project to evaluate if they should become permanent cost-effective solutions to providing safer streets in Bend.

In the River West neighborhood:

As part of the Bend Bikeway project, the City is planning to add diverters in the River West Neighborhood to reduce cut-through traffic and minimize conflicts with cyclists or pedestrians. Based on public feedback, locations were identified along the existing Neighborhood Greenway routes:

- at the NW 15th Street/Galveston Avenue intersection, to restrict southbound traffic from entering NW 15th off of Galveston
- at NW 15th Street/Cumberland Avenue and NW 12th Street/Cumberland Avenue, to restrict certain vehicle turning movements
