

Project Overview

Goals

- Complete missing segment of the Deschutes River Trail
- Address failing pavement conditions
- Upgrade stormwater system
- Improve the transitions at Miller's Landing Park and Gilchrist Avenue

City-Parks Relationship

- 2023 BPRD and City of Bend entered into an intergovernmental agreement
- City of Bend leading project with technical and financial assistance from BPRD
- Design costs are split 50/50
- Designs will include a minimum 8-foot-wide accessible path

Consistent Themes

- Improve pedestrian and bicycle safety
- Reduce cut-through traffic
- Maintain safe & efficient traffic flow
- Improve Galveston crossing for bikes and pedestrians
- Maintain existing “low-key,” “quaint” feel
- Address rough road conditions
- Preserve existing landscaping
- Upgrade stormwater system
- Support for east-side parking

Comparing Design Alternatives

Two-way

- Greater project footprint than exists today
- Maintains existing traffic pattern

One-way

- Smaller project footprint than two-way option
- No traffic entering from NW Galveston Ave to Riverfront St
- NW Riverside Blvd used for access

Both Designs

- Improve bike & ped safety
- Preserve existing landscaping
- Utilize east-side parking
- Improve Galveston crossing
- Upgrade stormwater system
- Address rough road conditions
- Preserve existing landscaping
- Maintain the “quaint” feel


- Design concepts are intended to show overall project footprints and traffic patterns
