About the county vehicle fee

How much is the county fee?

The county fee is \$19 per year per vehicle, or \$38 for a two-year renewal. The fee applies to Multnomah County residents that pay a state vehicle registration fee. Trucks weighing 26,000 lbs. or more pay a separate weight/mile fee, according to state law. The county fee is in addition to the state DMV vehicle registration fee (amount varies). If a vehicle is registered within the Department of Environmental Quality's (DEQ) air testing area, a \$21 emissions certificate of compliance is also required.

How and when will county residents pay the fee?

Multnomah County residents will pay the new fee to the DMV when they renew their state vehicle registration. The fee can be paid at DMV offices, by mail or online at [OregonDMV.com \(link is external\)](http://OregonDMV.com). Or, if you do not have an address change at the time of renewal, county residents may pay the new fee at a DEQ vehicle inspection station after passing the required emissions test. Vehicles in Multnomah County with registration expiring during September 2010 or after will be assessed the new fee.

Where does the legal authority for the fee come from?

The Jobs and Transportation Act passed by the Oregon Legislature and signed by Governor Kulongoski in 2009.

How much money will the fee raise?

The fee is projected to raise \$127 million to help pay for the new [Sellwood Bridge](#). Funds will also be used to pay for the environmental review phase for the [Earthquake Ready Burnside Bridge project](#).

What's included in the vehicle fee county residents pay?

In addition to the state vehicle registration fee, Multnomah County residents will pay an additional fee of \$19 per year per vehicle (\$38 for a two-year renewal) to help pay for the new [Sellwood Bridge](#) and the planning phase of the [Earthquake Ready Burnside Bridge project](#).
