Snow and Ice Ordinance

No owner or person in charge of property improved or unimproved abutting a public sidewalk shall allow:

- A. Snow to remain on the sidewalk for a period longer than the first six hours of daylight after the snow has fallen or otherwise accumulated in commercial areas and one day in all other areas.
- B. Ice to remain on the sidewalk for more than six hours of daylight in commercial areas and one day in all other areas after the ice has formed unless the ice is covered with a suitable material to assure safe travel.
- C. A violation of this section is a Class B civil infraction for violation in all areas except for residential property. The penalty in residential areas is a Class C civil infraction.

The maximum penalty for a Class B infraction is \$460 a day; Class C infraction is \$260 a day.



Why Should I Remove Snow From My Sidewalk?

Many of our neighbors rely on a clear sidewalk to get to and from work or school or to access bus stops. Without a clear route, it becomes quite difficult or dangerous for pedestrians to get where they need to. When a sidewalk has not been cleared of snow or ice, pedestrians may be forced to walk in the road causing a dangerous situation for both the pedestrian and the driver. Snow and ice cause pedestrians using mobility devices to have restricted or difficult access to the sidewalk.

Please help keep the City of Bend safe and accessible for all of our citizens!



Helpful Hints for Snow Removal

- When shoveling snow, be sure to keep all of the snow on your property. Snow cannot be moved from the sidewalk into the street.
- The City of Bend's street crews do their best to keep from plowing snow back on the sidewalk however, it may still occur. In the event that a snow plow may cause more snow on your sidewalk, please know that it is still your responsibility to keep the sidewalk clear.
- On the back of this brochure is a resource directory of contractors who you can hire to maintain your sidewalk. The contractors listed are local, licensed and bonded for your protection. You may choose to respond to an ad on craigslist or use a college student in the neighborhood. If you do, please be sure that the work is done prior to payment.
- If you know of an elderly neighbor who may need help shoveling their sidewalk, please consider doing it for them. Many of our Neighborhood Associations participate in the Good Samaritan Program where an elderly or person with limited mobility can be adopted for the winter.
