Automated Traffic Enforcement to begin in January

In 2024, the Bend City Council directed the Bend Police Department to begin implementing an Automated Traffic Enforcement program that would add red light and speed cameras at certain intersections throughout the City of Bend.

Earlier this year, Bend Police selected Verra Mobility as its partner in the implementation of this program. Verra Mobility will place and maintain the cameras in three initial locations: NE 27th Street and Neff Road, SE Third Street and Reed Market Road, and SE Powers Road and Business 97.

At this time, the schedule indicates that the cameras will go live and warnings will be issued beginning on Jan. 30, and citations will begin being mailed out on March 3. That schedule may change depending on permitting and other factors.

State law requires that we place signs at the entrances to the City of Bend, as well as near the intersections where cameras will be located, in order to alert drivers to the automated traffic enforcement taking place here.

We're doing this for one reason: our community safety. The most common complaint we hear from the public is dangerous behaviors on our roadways, including speeding, running red lights and distracted driving because of cell phones. This program will supplement traditional traffic enforcement by officers—it will not replace that enforcement.

Our goal is to see a decrease in crashes at these intersections, and an overall drop in speed complaints as well. If you are ticketed, you will face a fine of between \$165 and \$440.

Those citations will be issued through the mail after evidence is reviewed by a law enforcement officer, and the ticketing process will run through the Bend Municipal Court, just as other traffic violations do.

We appreciate our community members all working together to keep our roads safe for everyone.



Top Offense Counts by Crime Category


Crimes Against People




Crimes Against Property



Crimes Against Society




Oregon Specific Offense

● 2021 ● 2022 ● 2023 ● 2024 ● 2025




Total Calls for Service
