


What is a TSAP?


Comprehensive, multidisciplinary approach to transportation safety → promotes USDOT's **Safe System Approach**

- **Evaluates** crash trends/issues based on current data
- **Identifies** broad range of strategies including projects, policies, and programs
- **Creates** a decision-making framework for the MPO/City
- **Helps** the MPO/City increase its eligibility for state and federal funding for safety projects





Demonstrates how projects and strategies reflect established policies, guidelines, standards, and practices that promote systemic safety improvements.





ENGAGEMENT PLAN



Guides community involvement for updating the TSAP



Identifies key messages, target audiences and specific tactics to reach them, and general timing of outreach activities

ENGAGEMENT PLAN

Goals

- **Increase awareness** of BMPO's transportation safety efforts and purpose
- **Engage broadly and equitably**, prioritizing communities disproportionately impacted by traffic risks
- **Listen and learn** by gathering community safety concerns and identifying top priorities
- **Close the loop** by integrating input into TSAP recommendations and communicating back to the community

Strategies

Date	Strategy	Description
Nov 2025 – 2026	<u>Project website</u>	Primary tool for TSAP information sharing with community.
Nov 2025	Engagement discussion	Discussion with BMPO and City staff to learn about BMPO's past engagement efforts, specific goals/ideas.
Nov–Dec 2025	Public Engagement Plan	Plan to inform people about safety conditions of Bend area transportation system and ask what needs to be better.
Jan, Apr, and Oct 2026	PAC meetings	PAC will provide multidisciplinary project guidance on public engagement.
Apr–Oct 2026	In-person events	BMPO staff will attend in-person community events to share and gather information.
Apr–Jun 2026	Virtual open house #1	Website, linked from Bend TSAP page, which includes basic project info and interactive feedback tools.
Sep–Oct 2026	Virtual open house #2	Website, linked from Bend TSAP page, which includes basic project info and interactive feedback tools.
Jan–Oct 2026	Promotional materials	Social media text and graphics plus content for email promotions to list of interested parties


