From the Chief

It's hard to believe the first quarter of 2026 has come and gone. In addition to our daily calls for service, we have had a variety of projects to keep us busy here at the Bend Police Department.

Most notably, our agency is launching Automated Traffic Enforcement this month. Beginning April 15, three intersections in Bend – SE Third Street and Powers Road; SE Third Street and Reed Market Road, and NE 27th Street and Neff Road – will activate red-light and speed cameras to help improve traffic safety in our community.

For the first month, these traffic cameras will issue warnings to those who speed through the intersection or who run red lights, including not coming to a complete stop before turning right on red. Beginning May 15, those warnings will end and citations will be issued.

Our community frequently ranks traffic violations as a top safety concern in Bend, and this is just one way we intend to help combat those issues. You'll encounter lots of information about this new program, including in local media, at meetings, on our website, even on the radio and Spotify.

Those aren't the only messages you might be seeing or hearing from Bend PD. We have launched a recruitment campaign– perhaps you've seen our billboards, heard our Spotify ads or encountered our airport advertisements while traveling for Spring Break? We are proud of the work we do here at the Bend Police Department, and we're looking for people who want to help make a difference in our community, whether they're coming to us from other agencies or new to the world of policing.



Polar Plunge

In February, Bend Police members hit the chilly Deschutes River to plunge for a great cause – our local Special Olympics athletes! The Bend Police Department was thrilled to be the top team fundraiser, bringing in more than \$9,500. Thanks to Red Robin and Greg’s Grill, which supported our two Tip-A-Cop events, and to the community who helped us nearly double our fundraising over 2025.

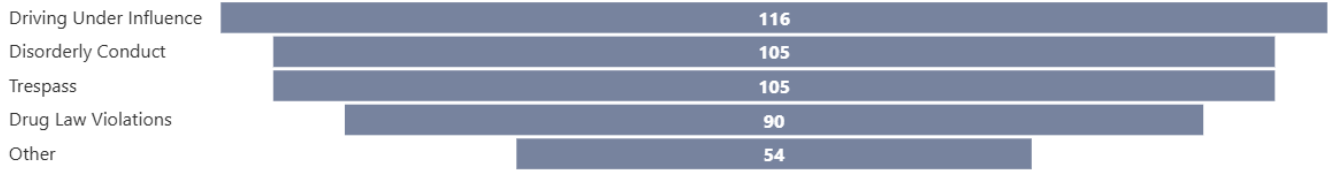

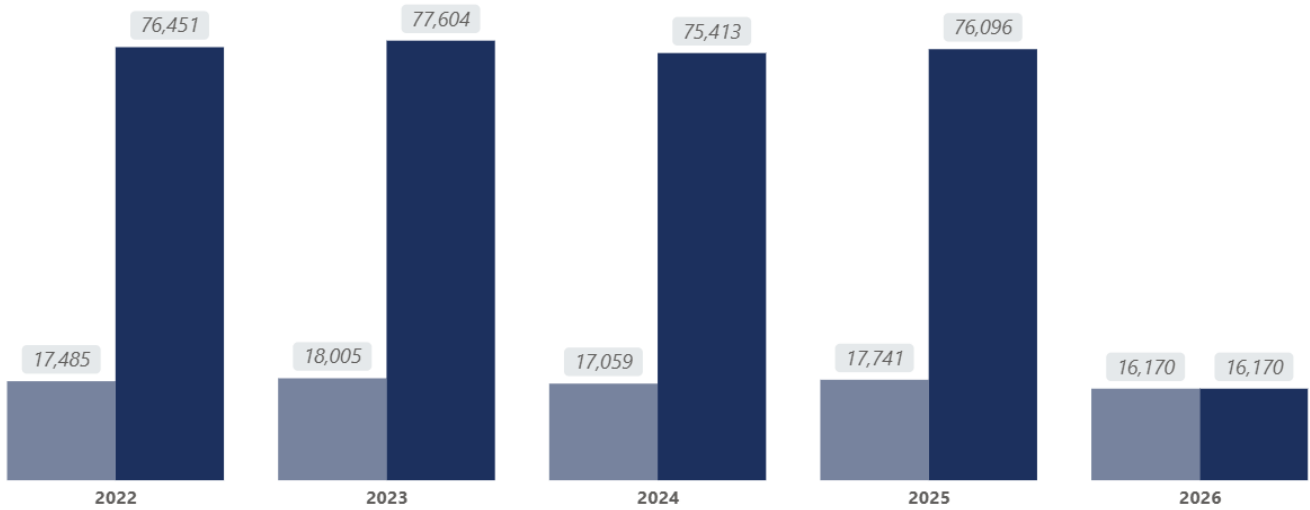
