TAKEDOWNS: 33

OLEORESIN CAPSICUM (OC SPRAY): 14

TASER DEPLOYMENTS: 13

FORCE IS NOT CONTROL HOLDS, HANDCUFFING, ESCORTING, OR SEARCHING A PERSON WITHOUT RESISTANCE.

THERE WAS NO USE OF DEADLY FORCE IN 2025.

WRAP Restraint use: 15 (used in 22 percent of force events)



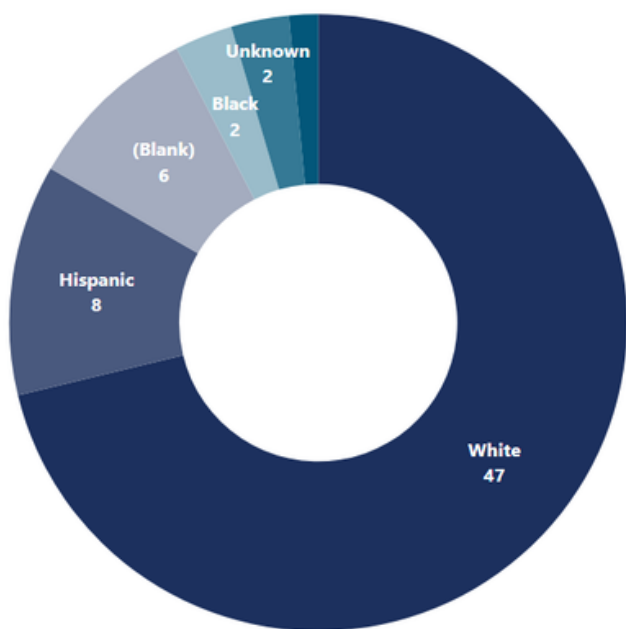
Demographics:

66 DISTINCT SUBJECTS WERE INVOLVED IN 67 INCIDENTS OF FORCE.

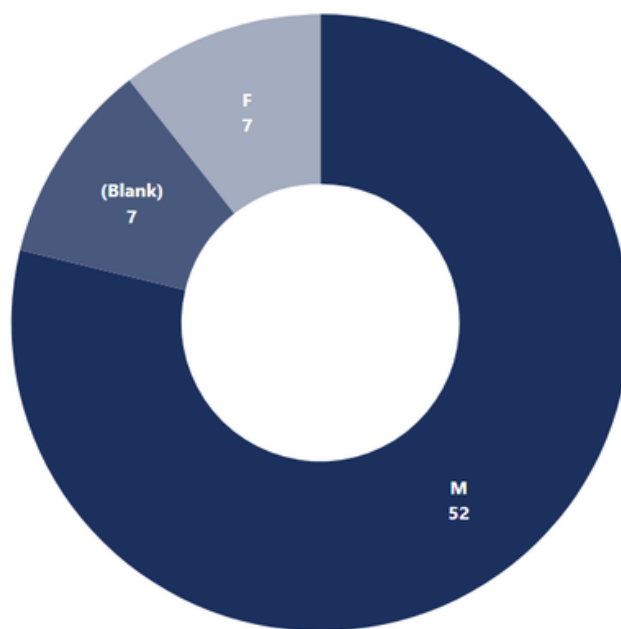
Subject Demographics - Race
