

# Archie Briggs Bridge Replacement Project

UPDATE #1

The City of Bend and the Oregon Department of Transportation are working together to replace the Archie Briggs Bridge to address the weight restrictions that have required heavier vehicles like larger fire trucks and school buses take a 4.46-mile detour since 2016. The bridge also lacks bike lanes and sidewalks, and the guardrails do not meet current City standards.

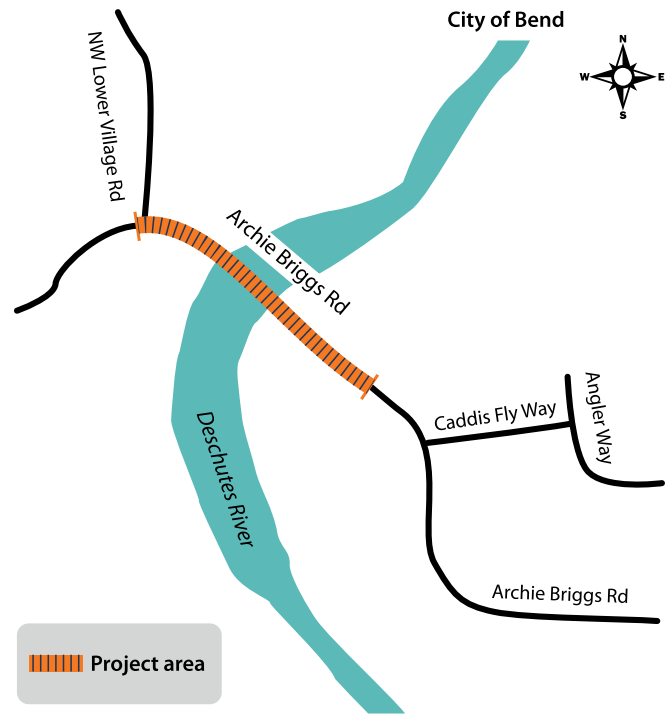
Currently in the Design Phase with construction planned to begin in spring 2028, the project will:

- Replace the current bridge spans.
- Remove the load restriction that currently limits access for heavier vehicles.
- Widen the bridge crossing to include two travel lanes, with sidewalks and bike lanes in each direction.
