# Why an electrification workshop series?

- Energy use in buildings drives ~50% of total GHG emissions; electrification reduces emissions
- Supports the City's decarbonization goals and Community Climate Action Plan (CCAP)



*Encourage upgrades in residential and commercial buildings that promote energy efficiency and reduce greenhouse gas emissions*

- Electrification can be confusing; helps residents understand options and local resources
- Aligns with other ongoing electrification efforts and Council direction on electrification/energy efficiency outreach

  - People of color
  - Indigenous community members
  - People living with disabilities
  - Rural communities
- Access to increased incentives from ETO

# Who Qualifies for this program?

You identify as a person of color, Indigenous community members, a person living with disabilities, a rural resident, **or** a household with low to moderate income

AND

You are a homeowner or renter in a single-family home, manufactured home, or small multifamily housing

AND

You live in Oregon and heat your home with electricity or natural gas provided by Pacific Power or Cascade Natural Gas. If you get your electricity from Central Electric Coop (CEC) but heat your home with Cascade Natural Gas, you still qualify!

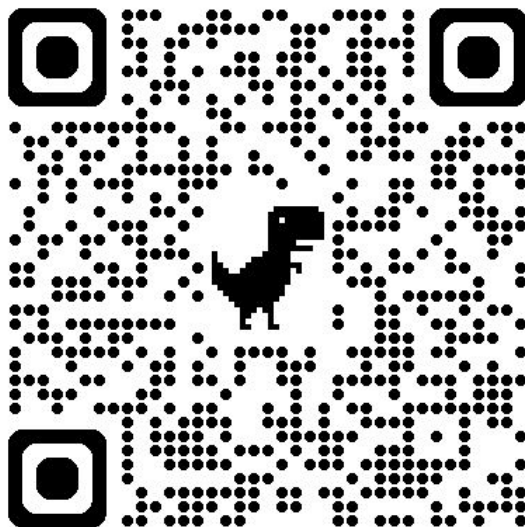

- Heat pumps
- Heat pump water heaters
- Clothes washers and dryers



# Program Goal

CEC's program goal is a deep home energy retrofit at no cost. We want ensure that the home occupant can stay as comfortable, safe and within their electric bill budget as possible based off the capability of the home.



# Program Requirements

- Home must receive power from CEC.
- Household must meet income requirements.
- Either have electric heating or water heating. If only water heating our offerings are limited to the what uses hot water.
- Renters can participate but must have the owner sign all necessary contracts.
